FAREWELL TO THE BASINGA'S ADVERTISING MANAGER AND LAYOUT ADVISOR

The Basinga bids a fond farewell to its long-serving **Advertising Manager** and **Layout Advisor**, **Tony Gray**. Tony's involvement with the Basinga dates back over 40 years!

Originally the Basinga was run by the church as the St Mary's Parish Church Magazine. These were the days of the mechanical typewriter, wax stencils, hand folding and stapling. With the expansion of the parish it was decided that to continue to produce a free copy for every household, a dedicated team of people would be needed. To this end the church handed over the production to a group of church and non-church residents, properly constituted as the Basinga Management Committee, of which Tony was a founder member.

Under the guidance of the Management Team the magazine production has progressed using photocopiers, word processors to desktop publishing and commercial printing in no small part to the efforts of Tony in his role as Layout Advisor. In his other role as Advertising Manager, he has been responsible for attracting paid advertising to the Basinga, which as this covers the cost of production, has over the years ensured the magazine has been able to, and continues





to be, distributed free of charge each month to households in Old Basing and Lychpit.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH AWARD

Nominations for this award will be considered at the **Parish Council** meeting on **Tuesday**, **7th December**, so it is still not too late to nominate a local community group that you feel is worthy of receiving a £100 boost to its finances.

BOXING DAY WALK

After many years of planning and leading the Annual Boxing Day Walk, **Tony Stoney** has decided to step down. This is an opportunity for someone else, possibly already a participant on the Boxing Day Walk, who is familiar with local footpaths to take over and lead the 2021 walk and perhaps those in future years. If you would like to take on this annual event, please contact the Parish Office to discuss how you wish to promote it.

COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION

Following the resignation of **Richard Barker** we are seeking a **Councillor** to represent **Old Basing**. If you are interested and wish to support your community in this way, please contact the Parish Office.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP EVENT

Due to the ongoing threat of Covid this event will **not now go ahead in December** as originally planned. Whilst we value the opportunity to meet with volunteers and group members, the health and well-being of those attending is our prime consideration.

LOCAL DEVELOPMENT THREAT

In September Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council published an update to the Local Plan, covering the requirement for new housing developments. The Council claim there is a shortfall of 7,700 new homes across the Borough and identified various sites where these could be built. Three of their short-listed sites are in the countryside around Old Basing and Lychpit. These are:

1) **OLD001** Land on the western boundary of Old Basing and Lychpit (450 houses)

2) **OLD002** Lodge Farm – land next to the area above (900 houses proposed)

3) **OLD007** Hodds Farm – land on the southern boundary of Old Basing (800 houses)

Your Parish Council is firmly of the view that these developments will destroy large tracts of the parish countryside; cause significant infrastructure issues; damage the ecological environment; adversely impact water courses and drainage; and act counter to local and national climate change initiatives. It intends to strongly refute the proposals and will seek support from the community in the months ahead.







LETTER TO THE EDITOR - SOLVE

In reply to Tony Wright's letter in the November edition of the Basinga:

This letter could have been drafted by the Borough Council Leader. Officers must work within the rules, but this does not stop them challenging them. Unfortunately, this emerging Local Plan is using 7-year-old data (2014), when later data is available.

For information, SOLVE has recalculated the housing requirement using 2018 evidence and found the requirement is 342 hpa (homes per annum) as against the 900 hpa using 2014 evidence. We understand that CPRE's independently calculated figure agrees with ours.

Maria Miller MP has stated that Basingstoke and Deane has built more new homes over the last 40 years than any other urban area in the Southeast, yet Basingstoke and Deane's growth is set to continue to accelerate at a faster rate than is needed.

Basingstoke and Deane's current emerging Local Plan sets out a growth rate twice as high as both the UK and Hampshire's. This is unnecessary and speaker after speaker objected to this at the Housing and Planning Committee meeting and demonstration on 2nd September. Further, at the full council meeting on 14th October, the following was agreed unanimously – "This Council rejects 17,820 units as the housing figure in the Local Plan Review."

Despite this, the Council Leadership continue with their growth agenda and appear to be rolling over and accepting the obvious flaws in the housing requirement. SOLVE challenges this proposed housing requirement. It is inexcusable to use outdated data for the emerging Local Plan.

New Government planning rules and an Environment Bill are due soon. Climate Change action is urgent, and it would be hypocritical if the Government failed to give strong protection for the countryside.

On the **Saturday**, **Mill Cottage Farm** will bring their animals to allow folk to enjoy them, while on the **Sunday** the **reenactors** of the **English Civil War Society** will be bringing their Tudor kitchen and talking about traditional cooking in the days when Basing House was in its prime.

Car parking for both events is in our car park near Bartons Mill. If you have to drive, please don't try to park in The Street – there just isn't room. The **Fayre** is **open** from **11am** to **4pm**. **Admission** is £3.50 for **adults** and £2.50 for **children**.

After that all goes quiet until the 2022 season starts. But in the meantime, work continues restoring the brickwork in the wall facing The Street and in other places around the site.

Many of our visitors ask about our 100-metre long, 1-metre high, tunnel, often remembering it from their childhood. It is still alive and well and was used for the first time this year when some brave souls crawled through it during the Halloween tours at the end of October. Some brickwork is being restored there, too.



MAYOR'S RIVER LODDON POETRY COMPETITION

Mayor's competition inspires young poets to celebrate the River Loddon. Young writers are being urged to follow in the footsteps of famous poets inspired to verse by the River Loddon in the **Mayor's Poetry Competition 2021**.

Basingstoke and **Deane Mayor Clir Onnalee Cubitt** has chosen a celebration of the River Loddon as the theme for her poetry competition open to children aged 5 to 16 years old.

The River Loddon, which flows through the borough, is one of just 224 chalk streams in the world, many of which are in the south of England. Chalk streams are vital, a unique part of our biodiversity of plants and animals and need protecting and preserving.

Cllr Cubitt said: "Now we're asking the modern young poets of Basingstoke and Deane to write in celebration of our chalk stream. The aim of this competition is to bring children closer to nature and encourage them to treasure our beautiful local environment, a very fitting theme when the international focus is on climate change and preserving biodiversity."

There are **three age categories:** 5 to 7, 8 to 11 and 12 to 16. An **iPad** is up for grabs for the **winner in each category**, with **book tokens** for the **runners-up**. The three winners and three runners-up will be invited to a presentation ceremony hosted by the Mayor early next year.

The judges are looking for original work that expresses hope, fear, anger, joy or any other response to the River Loddon. Poems should be **no longer than 750 words** and must be submitted to **mayor@basingstoke.gov.uk** by the **closing date** of **Friday, 17th December.**

DECEMBER IN YOUR GARDEN

There is no reason to stop attending to the garden now as we enter the colder months. Being outside and engaging with nature is known to lower your heart rate and blood pressure while exposure to natural light boosts the immune system, improves mood and aids sleep. With the days shortening and temperatures dropping there has never been a better excuse to get out in your gardens.

I would suggest the first job is to check on any greenhouses, polytunnels and other outside structures through the winter to ensure that they are sturdy enough to withstand anything the weather can throw at them. While you are at it, it is also a good time to check the protection on tender perennials so that the cold doesn't creep in and destroy them. Pots should also be raised onto feet or bricks if you haven't already done so lest they become waterlogged. Any tubs or pots that are liable to cracking due to frost should be wrapped in bubblewrap, hessian or fleece to prevent this from happening.

Continue to clear flowerbeds of leaves and cut back plants that have gone over, unless you want to leave these as winter habitats for insects. It is particularly important that alpines are not left with decaying plant matter on them as thy will die off if left damp for too long. You can mulch around them with gravel to help with drainage and for other plants that will suffer with mud splashes, and then bark-chip mulch can be used to keep them at their best. If your soil tends towards being heavy and claggy, or even filled with big lumps of chalk, then you can work in lots of composted organic matter to help improve it for next year. This will have the added bonus of keeping you warm with lots of digging!

Waterlogging can also be a problem on lawns, if you can't help walking on it when it is wet it will eventually die back and therefore it might be worth considering installing some stepping stones or a path to allow access to the areas you need to reach without causing damage to the grass in the process. If you lay the stones or pavers at a low enough level, they won't interfere with mowing, which might still be necessary if the weather stays above 41°F (5°C) or so as the grass will keep growing at this temperature. Damaged lawn patches can be repaired with turves cut from other areas of the garden and all lawn edges should be re-cut to keep them tidy and to save work next season.

If you have a pond heater, make sure you use it to keep the water from freezing over which can be fatal for fish and other pond life. If you don't have a heater, please don't be tempted to crack the ice as this can damage the fish. Instead, use a saucepan of hot water to melt a hole and allow an air hole. Foraging herons can be deterred using nylon strings at least 6ins (15cm) from the ground and in from the edges of the pond. If you would like to make your pond more wildlife friendly, now is a good time to do it in preparation for next season.

Now is the prime time to prune apple and pear trees that are in open ground (not against a wall). You are aiming to achieve a balanced, open goblet-like structure, but better to prune too lightly than too hard. There is always next year! Acers, birches and vines can also be pruned now, as they need to be done before Christmas to avoid bleeding. You can take hardwood cuttings of plants now if you need to increase your stock. You can also continue to plant deciduous trees and shrubs.

In this Covid-dominated world it's been a tough year for all of us but at least our gardens have blossomed due to the extra care and attention they have received. Let us make sure we keep it up.

Happy Christmas and hoping more than ever for a healthy, Covid-reduced new year.

NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER

Hopefully, many of you who have nesting boxes in your gardens, either fixed to trees or screwed to the house or shed, did have some success during this year's breeding season. Now that there is no chance of any young birds or fertile eggs being present it's a good time to take the box down and clean it out of deteriorating debris. However, many small birds, particularly Blue Tits, use a box in which to roost (sleep) in during the long winter nights and they will also explore them to see if there are any bugs to eat and even prospect the box as a nesting opportunity next spring. So, if you do clean it out, remount it straight

away and perhaps put a little dry grass or hay inside for any bird to cosy down in. Most days this week (w/e 5th November) we've seen tits clambering over several boxes within eyeshot here and Terry MacInish sent his photo (*right*) of one bird snuggled down in his camera box.

Another common bird that changes its behaviour somewhat in the autumn and winter is the Starling. Mostly overlooked as 'just another



bird', the Starling has a gorgeous shimmering green hue to its speckled plumage and possesses a talent for getting the greatest variety of notes into its song. But its also a very gregarious creature and often joins hundreds if not thousands of other birds as dusk approaches, which is commonly known as a murmuration. You have probably seen on TV huge flocks sweeping around the sky until they all (somehow) agree to settle in a reed bed or on a remote structure for the night. Well, Old Basing has now for a couple of years had its own mini-murmuration and over the past week or two I've seen several small groups of birds seemingly 'picking up' others as they circle the area, ending up with perhaps 150 to 200 birds. Now about three years ago when I saw this happening, I tracked them down to a single conifer in Chalk Vale but does anybody know where they are roosting now? One would surely hear them if they were close to one's house as they make a right din until it's just about dark, then they clam right up until they fly off at daybreak. Please let me know if its you!

With safety in numbers being paramount to any we will soon be seeing gatherings of Redwings that have made their way down from Scandinavia as the winter deepens there. Already, up to half a million early travellers have made their way across the country heading down further south to France and Iberia but some are settling here already. This morning (9th November) I noted two flocks of approximately 150 birds travelling west, but with it being so mild currently these guys may also want to keep going. Berries are the Redwings 'thing' and as long as the wood pigeons don't clear them beforehand, you may be blessed to see these visitors, with their rust-coloured wing flashes and pale over-eye stripe or hear them chatting away on a Holly or Cotoneaster bush in your garden. Pictures please!

Finally, thanks to **Debbie Filer** for the splendid photo *(see front cover)* of a **Red-Legged Partridge** sitting on her garden fence. Waiting for the first day of Christmas perhaps?


