

made crafts, produce and gifting ideas to browse and buy. Mulled wine and festive treats will also be available. On Saturday, visitors can enjoy our Nativity scene with animals from Mill Cottage Farm and on Sunday, re-enactors from the Marquess of Winchester Regiment will be staging an English Civil War living history event.

We can look back on an eventful year as we got back in the swing of things post Covid. The massive event staged by the Sealed Knot re-enactors must have been the high spot, but we can also remember a visit from the English Civil War Society, Tudor Day, the late Summer Fair and taking over 200 people on spooky Halloween Ghost Tours (see photos this page). Children enjoyed the Easter Egg trail, and later the fairy trail too.

MEMORIES OF OLD BASING IN THE 1940S

I was born in Newbury in 1937, and my family moved to Old Basing in approximately 1941, when I was three or four years of age. My parents were George and Dorothy Robbins. My sister Elizabeth Ann was born in 1938. Dad was born in Sherborne St John, and my mother was born in Thatcham near Newbury.

We lived in a cottage at Lower Mill Farm, along Newnham Road in Old Basing, opposite Lower Mill, which was operating as a mill in those days. Next door lived Mrs Lucy Bridgeman with her daughter Edie, Mr Bridgeman was away in the army.

Dad worked at Thorneycroft in Basingstoke in 'War Work'. He worked night shifts and I remember my mother packing up his food and tea flask for him to take each night. But I had no idea how he went to work late at night as it is a long way into Basingstoke from Pyott's Hill. No cars or transport in those days.

In those long evenings (only candlelight because of blackout) I was put into my mother's bed and we both listened to Vera Lynn and Victor Sylvester on the radio, which was the only entertainment. My sister, still a baby, slept in her cot nearby.

Later my father went away to war. After dad had gone away, probably about 1942, our mother and Mrs Bridgeman would sit together every evening with us three children, Evelyn, Betty and Edie. My mother would read to us (by candlelight as there was no electric light). I recall the many Enid Blyton stories which we all loved so much.

After dad had gone away to war, sometime later mum and Betty and I moved to a cottage further up Pyotts Hill, which was situated at the end of the farmtrack to Ramptons Farm (I think called Home Farm). On the other side of the road in Pyotts Hill there was a house called 'The Boltons' and we used to play with the several children who lived there.

Later when dad was away at war, my mother's sister, Auntie Mim, came to live with us. She told us she was also doing 'War Work'. Though a cook by profession, she had been recruited to work on the buses where she was a bus conductress for the Basingstoke Bus Company – I think it was Hants & Berks buses.

Auntie Mim living with us added a new dimension in our lives. I was always enthralled with her stories about suspected 'spies' she somehow encountered on the buses (from Old Basing to Basingstoke), and also how she had to walk in front of the bus on foggy or dark nights to show the driver the way, as the bus was not allowed to use headlights.

On the dark evenings mum would walk Betty and I up to the top of Pyotts Hill where it meets the main Reading Road. In the field opposite were the huge searchlights that would every night track for any enemy aircraft. We stayed for hours watching the searchlights which made us feel safe.

The woods just behind our house on Pyotts Hill, were our magical playground. Every day, along with other local children, we would spend hours in the woods collecting the long strands of silver paper dropped to intercept enemy aircraft.

But these adventures would temporarily cease when Granny Bradley from Newbury came to stay! We were ordered by her not to go into the woods because there were Germans hiding in there! But our play days resumed when she returned to Newbury. And no-one ever found a German in those woods.

THE MILL FIELD LOCAL NATURE RESERVE



Event news: Why not have a break from Christmas shopping and try out conservation work for a couple of hours at your local nature reserve on Sunday, 4th December instead. We are completely dependent on volunteers to look after the Mill Field. keep the scrub in check for the wildlife and open up the views for the many walkers who use the site every day. You don't need to book in advance just come along on the day, the more the

merrier. No experience is necessary just wear appropriate clothes and footwear and we will provide tea, coffee and tools. You will find us on the lower path, starting at 10.00am.

Both the group and the council are focused on clearing dog wood this winter, its taken over the site and a variety of methods are being used to remove it. The more help we have the more we can clear, so if you can make it, it would be very appreciated.

What to Look out for this month: Considering its December, it will be guite busy on the bird front, so binoculars to the ready: the numbers of Fieldfares and Redwings will build up with groups of Siskin and Goldfinches moving around. The Linnets should be grouping as they start to roost and if you are lucky you may see some lesser Redpoll, Brambling or the giant of finches the Hawfinch, all of which have already been spotted this autumn. Little Egrets will also be grouping in the evening by the pub, or you might see a Green Sandpiper or Snipe in the lower meadow.



IF SOMETHING YOU'VE ORDERED HASN'T ARRIVED



If you bought something from a business to be delivered: it's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered to you. If the seller used a courier, they should chase the courier to find out what has happened to your order - it's not your responsibility. Check the delivery address you gave the seller. Then contact them and ask where your order is. If the seller claims they've delivered it or don't know where it is, you can ask for a redelivery. You might be able to get a refund in some circumstances.

If your item left with a neighbour or somewhere else has gone missing:

If **Royal Mail** left something with a neighbour or in a certain place because you told them to, it's not the seller or Royal Mail's responsibility if it gets lost. If Royal Mail left something with a neighbour or in a certain place and you didn't tell them to, it's the seller's responsibility if it gets lost. You should contact the seller to ask for a redelivery or a refund - you can phone, email or write a letter.

Your item was delivered by a courier then check your terms and conditions or account details – they might include other places for delivery, like your porch or a neighbour's house. If you agreed to them, it's not the seller's responsibility if your order has gone missing. If your item wasn't delivered to the location you agreed, it's the seller's legal responsibility to sort out the issue. You can ask them to redeliver your item. You can ask for a full refund if: a delivery date was essential and wasn't met; a delivery date was agreed but wasn't essential, and a second date also wasn't met; no delivery date was agreed and a second chance to deliver was not successful

A delivery date is essential if you told the seller you needed your delivery by a specific date. An item can also be considered 'essential' if it's obvious from the circumstances. For example, a wedding cake that was ordered for the day of a wedding.

For either a refund or a redelivery, you can phone, email or write a letter

DECEMBER IN YOUR GARDEN

December weather is often the worst of the year in that it is grey, wet, cold, and dank. However, if we get cold, frosty weather then the garden can be transformed into a glittering wonderland and suddenly all kinds of winter jobs are possible from winter pruning, gathering up those papery leaves and tidying up those messy borders. As we approach the shortest day of the year you will need work to keep you warm outside, such as digging and tree pruning. Check your winter protection and if you have a greenhouse make sure the heater is working.

- Dig over empty borders and prepare your soil for next year's planting.
- Group potted plants together and on trestles in a sheltered spot in the garden to protect them from the harshest winter weather.
- Get pruning! Apples and pears but not plums, roses and Japanese maples are just some of the plants that benefit from a winter prune.
- Look after the birds clean feeders, stock up on wild bird food (squirrels permitting) and make sure they have access to fresh water.
- Look for your surplus plants for Christmas gifts.

Try making your own Christmas wreath. It may not quite have the professional finish but there is something about using whatever you can find to create a thing personal to you. Yes, the holly can be very painful to use, Japonica sometimes "loose" their berries before we get there but the birds are welcome to them and making a wreath to hang on your front door is a lovely welcoming gesture at Christmas. Just have a go yourself, its free and creative.

This is an opportunity to bring our outdoors in! Garden foliage and other odds and ends found in the treasure trove that is the back garden, can make stunning festive displays, centre pieces and even the main event – the Christmas tree itself! Consider a Christmas tree in a pot that you can use year after year. You never know what



you might unearth if you go for a forage in the foliage or root around in the rough. Logs, twigs, stones, pebbles, leaves, and branches can make super versatile Christmas objects. Try making a window box with silver foliage plants and bright red cyclamen - it will look fabulous! Relax in the knowledge that as well as creating stunning, one-of-a-kind festive masterpieces, you are also doing your bit for the planet and bring your own potpourri of natural fragrance to your home. Its never too early (in December) to get

Hopefully there are not too many jobs left to do this year so you will have time for some fireside garden planning. Take stock of your gardening year. Do not be disheartened by your gardening imperfections or failures, but devote some time to pondering what you will do differently in the coming year. Unfortunately, the world is changing and this has the impact on all our plants. We just must be smarter in what we do with what we have. December can be dark and wet but its also a month of wonder and opportunity to reflect on what we can do for ourselves and others in the new year.

NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER

As becomes the British weather, we went from hose pipe bans to floods in a matter of weeks but as long as you were not hit with a soaking you have to say 'the garden has never looked greener.

However along with torrential rain and high winds there have been days of lovely warm sunshine, so much so that butterflies have taken to the wing with Stephen Thair spotting a Peacock last weekend (29th Oct) and Pat Brace noting a Red Admiral basking in his garden too.

Now is the time for cleaning your nest boxes, bird tables and feeders. For the former task, its good if you can rake out the old material which might well be damp and contain remains of dead chicks, egg- shells or mites. Dry the box out of necessary and replace (assuming you're happy with its location), perhaps adding a little bit of dry grass or dead leaves. As for grubby feeders, well, they can spread many diseases to birds and when the food gets wet, it does end up with an extremely unpleasant smell so bin it and start again! Your feathered friends will love you this coming winter if you treat them right.

One big bonus about westerly storms at this time of the year is that many species of birds get blown here from the USA east coast and Atlantic areas so keen twitchers check their pagers etc for news of a sighting. Last week there was a UK first reported from Bryher in

the Scilly Isles in the form of a Blackburnian Warbler, a bird named after a British naturalist in the 18th century but now regarded as one of America's most beautiful birds (it acquires a fiery orange throat as a mature bird, the bird seen was a juvenile). Meanwhile, at the other end of the country in Shetland, birders flocked to get a sighting of a Swainson's Thrush, one of several Myrtle Warblers (photo right) or perhaps glimpse a few of the twenty Hornemans Arctic Redpolls that had arrived on the wind (no, me neither!)



What becomes of these vagrants in time one shudders to think but for the die-hard bird spotter these once in a lifetime sightings are tremendous news.

So, like me, there is zero chance of many of us seeing or recognising anything as rare as the above but closer to home the same can be said for one of this country's favourite mammals. I refer to the badger. How many people have actually seen a live one? Well, Alan Williams from Park Lane can now claim this as, last week, whilst being driven along Tunworth Lane near Polecat corner, a young bruin was spotted trotting alongside the road before zipping up and over the bank. The cub being small enough to probably be one of this year's offspring was at least sensible enough to turn THAT way rather than out into the road where many meet their end, and where sadly, is often the only place we get to see one. **PLEASE NOTE:** I have done away with my landline so for all Nature notes or bird food requirements please use mobile **07900 648675** or email as below.
