#### **GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS TO BE SUSPENDED**

Garden waste collections are set to be temporarily suspended in Basingstoke and Deane owing to bin crew staff absences.

The difficult decision to delay restarting the fortnightly collections after Christmas comes following discussions between waste contractor Serco and Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council. This will allow the crews to focus on the core waste and recycling services, where there is currently a backlog of collections from the Christmas and new year period.

The temporary suspension will take effect from the fortnightly collections due in the week of Monday, 10th January and will enable crews to prioritise the 216,000 weekly waste, recycling and clinical waste collections. The staffing situation will be regularly reviewed and the service will restart when the council is confident that Serco can resume a reliable service.

Garden waste subscriptions will be extended to cover the missed collections, meaning that service users will get the full number of collections that they have paid for in the year.

### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

#### **ANNUAL PARISH AWARD**

The first award to a Group was agreed at the December Parish Council meeting and went to the **St Mary's Churchyard Conservation Group**, nominated by Rick Bourne. Many of us admire the snowdrops and primroses in early spring, but without the hard work of this group of volunteers they would probably be smothered by weeds and brambles. The Parish Council's donation of £100 will be used towards the purchase of gardening tools and other items needed to enable them to continue this valuable work.

#### **Local Plan Consultation**

The Parish Council have appointed Consultants to assist us in preparing robust rebuttal documents against the Local Plan Proposals for 001 (East Basingstoke), 002 (Lodge Farm) and 007 (Hodds Farm). The map (see page 13) shows each of the three areas subject to planning outlined in red.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council have announced that the planning process has been deferred for four to six months and the formal consultation will now take place in late summer. We will provide more information once this becomes available.

#### BASING ROAD AND COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

Redrow has now started work on the 100 homes on Basing Road near the Hampshire Clinic of which forty will be affordable housing and the development project will include a footway from the Swing Swang Lane roundabout to the Loddon Bridge. This development will also provide Old Basing and Lychpit Parish with substantial cash for infrastructure improvements over several years. Possible projects might include climate change and greening measures or other footway improvements.

The Parish Council is inviting suggestions from residents as to how the money might be spent to enable it to plan ahead and ensure funds are used in the way residents wish. Please send any suggestions to the Clerk (see page 13).

#### **CLIMATE ACTION**

We had hoped to be able to follow our successful November meeting at Lychpit Hall with a development session at the start of December but unfortunately Covid intervened. Our next session will probably be virtual (date to be arranged) and we will send joining details to those on our contact list. If you have not contacted us yet and wish to be involved, email stephen.brown@oldbasing.gov.uk - copies of presentations shown at the November meeting are on our website; if you were unable to attend, or would like to be reminded of the session you can get a flavour of the content from these. Additionally, we have included a booklet from Energy Alton detailing case studies of how a variety of properties in the town can be heated more efficiently and sustainably. Energy Alton offers a range of services including the loan of a thermal camera. They will also visit residents to give a free survey and provide advice as how best to reduce energy loss and lower costs. We hope we may soon be able to do something similar for residents of Old Basing and Lychpit. Meanwhile, by the time you read this, some of us will have had a (virtual) meeting with Community Energy South to see whether they are able to help us progress and seek grant funding. We have already had some enquiries from residents on energy efficiency and are looking to move forward in providing advice in this area plus how to create energy locally, low carbon transport, recycling, and a repair café. If you have suggestions, or would like to be involved, please get in touch.





### **SOLVE – SAVE OUR LODDON VALLEY ENVIRONMENT**

**River Contaminated by Sewage Spillage,** an article in the Basingstoke Gazette by Patrick Knox shows that since January 2010, when this article was written, we really have not made enough progress. We have built many thousands of houses and we know more houses,



more people, more sewage. If you smell or see sewage please report it, otherwise it's a case of 'No Data No Problem'!

Farmers do NOT muck spread at this time of year as the crops do not need it. Wind direction is a big factor in where odour is carried. Whether you are at Blackdam ponds (known combined sewer overflows), Piggy Dam, on the footpaths in the valley, or Chineham shopping centre, if you smell or see sewage it is vital that you report it.

### LOCAL PLAN UPDATE - IS THIS FAIR AND REASONABLE?

Redrow is on site now with diggers at Swing Swang lane for 100 dwellings. The County Council continues to hold off on the 450 houses at Pyotts Hill and will probably wait for this Local Plan Update to see if they can increase to 900 houses and whether the Taylor Wimpey option on the adjacent Lodge Farm site of 900 houses is allocated.

Old Basing has 1,600 dwellings and the short-listed Hodds Farm (behind scout hut and up to A30) with 800 dwellings proposed will increase the existing village by 50% – how can this enable us to retain the character of the village? Development on this scale is neither fair nor reasonable. See map page 13 for details of proposed developments outlined in red.

The cumulative impact of these potential allocations on Lychpit and Old Basing is horrific in terms of traffic, access to schools and GPs, community and village feel, just to start with. We will become an urban suburb of greater Basingstoke unless we all act now.

The Council Leader's ambition is to be the 'Capital of the South'. SOLVE continues to campaign and your help and support is always appreciated. Contributions gratefully received towards professional advice. Our case will need to be made before June.

A little kindness can seem insignificant, but kindness changes things – whether it gives somebody a little extra spring in their step for a day, or changes the fates of nations, isn't important. Somebody's life is still being changed for the better.

I've witnessed the wonderful kindness displayed here in Old Basing and Lychpit and it inspires me. Remember that kindness is for ourselves, too, so be kind to yourselves - it really does make it easier to be kind to others.

What to Look Out For This Month: Look out for Winter Finches, particularly larger numbers of Siskins, Bramblings and Redpolls, in particular see if you can spot the Meally Redpoll which is slightly bigger than the normal Redpoll. We should also be seeing the Winter Thrushes such as the Fieldfare, large numbers of Linnets will be roosting in the field too and the Waxwings should still be around. This winter we have had good numbers of Little Egrets coming in both onsite and around the fish ponds by the barn where the Yellowhammer maybe roosting amongst the reed beds and Kingfishers are seen regularly.

### HOW TO IDENTIFY THE UK'S FIVE OWLS

Owls are among our most captivating birds and, with a good view, are easily distinguished from other UK birds. But how to tell one owl from another? Here's a guide to the UK's five resident species:

### Barn owl (see photo, right, by Tony Matthews)

A very pale, slender owl, typically white on the underparts and golden-brown with grey markings on the upperparts. It has a white, heart-shaped facial disk with dark eyes. Usually seen over grassland or farmland at dawn and dusk, though can be seen at night or even during the day.

Its call resembles eerie squeals and a shrieking 'shreeee'.

### Tawny owl

A mostly brown owl with a large, rounded head. Slightly larger than a barn owl and usually seen in woodland.

Plumage is mottled brown but can vary from greyish to reddish brown.

In flight, it shows broad, rounded wings and flies with quick wingbeats in long, straight glides. The tawny's rich vocal repertoire includes a short 'ke-wik' contact call and a quavering 'hoo, hu-hooo' advertising call.

#### Short-eared owl

A sandy-brown owl similar in size to a tawny, but with longer wings. It has a streaked breast, but a pale belly with thick dark barring on the tail and piercing yellow eyes.

In flight, it shows long, narrow wings that are slightly longer and slimmer than long-eared owls, with black wingtips. Flies with slow wingbeats and wavering glides.

Males perform display flights at breeding grounds, giving a fast series of deep hoots and short, quick wing-claps. Other calls include rapid, rasping barks when alarmed.

### Long-eared owl

This streaky brown owl looks very similar to a short-eared owl but has darker feathers and less of a yellow hue. The facial disk is buff with a well-defined blackish border and white 'eyebrows' extending towards the beak. It has deep orange eyes and long 'ear-tufts' atop the head.

In flight, it's tricky to tell from the short-eared owl. Slightly shorter and more blunt-tipped wings, with fine black barring on the wingtips and no white trailing edge to the upper wing.

Males advertise with deep, soft hoots without inflection given every few seconds, while females have a more nasal call.

#### Little owl

A small owl with a flattened crown. The upperparts are dark brown with whitish streaks and spots, with whitish underparts featuring bold brown streaks. Facial disk is greyish brown with prominent whitish 'eyebrows' giving a stern expression. Eyes are yellow.

Flies with a fast, bounding flight like a thrush. Hunts by swooping from perches but will also run across ground to pursue prev.

The little owl's various calls include a fast 'chi-chi' alarm call, a low-pitched hoot and a mewling call.

### LINGUATASTIC LANGUAGE SCHOOL



Chinese New Year falls on Tuesday, 1st February, this year (well at least that's when the celebrations officially start). The celebration is actually also known as **chunjie**, the Spring

Festival, when people say goodbye to the wintery colder days and look forward to new beginnings and fresh starts.

There are all sorts of ways of celebrating, but just like many festivals in other parts of the world, there is a great emphasis on food. Many of the desserts eaten around this time of the year have special meanings behind them, often deriving from the puns in their names. For example, there is dessert called **tangyuan** which literally means 'soup balls'. But it sounds like **tuanyuan**, which means reunion. And then there's **fa gao**, which is a type of steamed cupcake, dyed in festive colours. The **fa** is the same as in **fa cai**, which means 'to get rich'. Indeed, one of the cake's characteristics is that it often splits at the top when cooked. Some people therefore call it the 'smiling steamed cake'. And what makes it even more curious for those interested in languages is that the Hakka people, call the split at the top of the cake **'xiao'**, which means smiling, which in Chinese characteristics resembles a sign of a coming fortune. And so yes, you guessed it, the bigger the **'xiao'**, the better!

### **FEBRUARY IN YOUR GARDEN**

February can be a very mixed month, from sunshine warm enough to be in the garden without a coat, to heavy snow. Take advantage on good days to get out in to the garden to work or to survey what needs to be done later in the year. As the weather can be unpredictable just be patient! If nothing else, you can spend time finishing off any trimming of dead growth, clipping back and general preparation for the new growing season.

An interesting tip I was given in regard to growing Tomatoes is to search for Crimean varieties, such as 'Black Krim.' Not only do they taste superb, most Tomato varieties are grown for warmer climates, whereas the South Ukraine has a similar climate to our own, allowing them to grow better in cooler conditions, and in theory, crop longer.

A last-chance warning: now is the last month you can sow garlic. To form good cloves it needs to spend ten consecutive days at a temperature below 10°C (50°F). You can of course place them in a fridge if you so desire.

Continue to prepare beds for planting. Those that have been completed can have black sheeting put over the top of them to keep them warmer and drier for springtime. Another advantage is that as the soil warms, weeds will start to grow, giving you a clean crack at the whip of removing them before anything is planted.

If you are looking for an easy crop to grow, that crops in winter when little else grows, gives fantastic flowers and tastes fantastic, then look at growing Jerusalem Artichokes. They are related to the sunflower family rather than Globe Artichokes, they grow in most soils and are the definition of plant and forget! The tubers make a fantastic soup.

I don't know why but when I think of Artichokes I also think of Asparagus. Now is a good time to start preparing the site where they are to grow, ensuring the ground has been dug thoroughly and weed free. It is also a good time to order the Asparagus crowns even though delivery may not be until late March or early April.

If the ground is not frozen, cane fruits can be planted now. Blueberry and gooseberry plants may be stirring into life; check the soil isn't too sodden or bone dry, especially container plants. Blackcurrant bushes should be inspected for swollen buds, caused by big bud mite, and disposed of.

Protect the blossoms of fruiting trees should they flower early again this year. Peach and Apricot are notoriously early anyway, and may need hand pollinating as there little else to do it for you! I also hand pollinate my pear trees, as they can also blossom before the bees.

If you are planning to grow climbing French or Runner beans this year, give them the best start by digging a trench where you plan to grow, lining with shredded newspaper and filling with kitchen waste (vegetable peelings, uncooked fruit and vegetables, tea bags, but not cooked meats, bones, cheese or milk) and back fill with soil. This gives the beans a much-needed nitrogen boost come summer.

With regards to lawns, in frosty or snowy weather, keep off the grass as it can cause significant damage and lead to disease later in the year. Otherwise, you can brush off any worm casts with a stiff broom, besom or rake, so it's ready for its first cut. So now is an opportune time to get your lawnmower serviced. If you're planning on sowing a new lawn, weeds growing on areas of ground prepared for grass-seed-sowing should be brought under control before sowing begins in April.

### **NATURE NOTES FOR FEBRUARY**

The dexterity a bird has in making a nest using just its beak is astonishing, but this, and its ability to migrate (where applicable) or sing a song is of course inherited from its genes. What fascinates me is how birds and indeed certain species of mammal, get to learn complex tricks to secure a meal. Waiting for the lights to change at the Reading Road roundabout, I observed a Common Gull scratching around in the grass verge looking for grubs. What it did next I have seen before but it nevertheless made me smile, and that was to stamp its feet quickly on the spot to 'worm-charm'.

Just in case you've don't know what this is but if you go out onto your lawn when its damp and tap the ground firmly with say the back of a spade, eventually large worms will work their way to the surface believing its rain. Anglers might do this to collect worms for bait but of course birds, ie gulls, do it for a quick snack! I've also seen footage of a wader bird offer a piece of bread into the waters edge where there are small fish to tempt them closer to eat said offering. Once they're nearer the surface, and the birds beak, the bread gets dropped and the fish is inside the wader before it knows what's happening.

Regular correspondent Stephen Thair reported a couple of Redwings in his garden around Christmas time plus 16 Blackbirds all feasting on crab apples. We know that the Redwings are northern visitors but its highly likely that some of the Blackbirds could be too. Ringing for the past decade or so has proven that they, plus even the 'British' robin, often turns out to be a Dutch or Belgian bird.

The hundred or so crab apples on our tree were small and bright red and I wondered if they might tempt some Thrushes, or dare I say, Waxwings to the garden, but no such luck. It was Wood Pigeons that ate the majority though a pair of Blackbirds did try a few.

Tony Stoney who as many of you know is a very keen walker and wildlife observer even in the foulest of conditions, reported some 50 to 60 Siskins performing a little murmuration between trees near the Incinerator last week, and yesterday (5th January), watched a pair of 'mad March hares' chasing each other around in a sunshine-soaked field near South Warnborough. It would seem that the spring-like conditions (which lasted exactly one day!) stirred their juices temporarily early before they probably realised that it was not yet the time to start thinking about a family.

We and the natural world can be forgiven however for getting occasionally confused about the seasons. The seriously mild spell over the New Year could spark trees and plants to start budding which could have devastating effects on dormancy, hibernation, and breeding cycles resulting in numerous species eventually dying out. But seeing the odd flower bloom out of season isn't new so when Alan Williams in Park Lane sent me the golden rose photo (see right), I wasn't surprised that it was called Molineux, as per the home of his beloved Wolverhampton Wanderers.



Alan says it's a sign that his team will be outstanding this year. We will see!!

It is not too early to give your compost heap a 'spring turn' this month. This will aerate and stimulate the heap. If it's too dry, adding wet kitchen waste and watering occasionally will help. If too wet, adding more carbon-rich materials such as twigs, cardboard and paper waste, will aerate the heap.

Next month the garden really starts to get going, so any preparation work that can be done now will save time later. It may be cold and miserable you will thank yourself for the effort.


