

#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

A very happy and, hopefully, more settled new year to all residents

#### **NEW COUNCILLOR**

At the December meeting we were pleased to co-opt Murray Campbell to fill the remaining Councillor vacancy, representing Old Basing. A resident of Lychpit, Murray has lived in the Parish for over 30 years so is very familiar with the local area and his wealth of experience in the business world will no doubt be very useful when he has settled into his role.

#### **MILKINGPEN LANE**

The Parish Council has long been pressing for parking restrictions along Milkingpen Lane and adjacent areas before a serious accident happens due to congestion during school drop-off and pick-up times. Our County and Borough Councillors have also backed this and helped in persuading the Borough Council to take action. Many residents may have already seen the traffic order and proposal advertised from 4th December and residents most closely affected should have been contacted direct. Full details including a plan are on the Parish Council website and any comments should be sent direct to the Borough Council at **engineering@basingstoke.gov.uk** (the consultation period ends on 8th January).

#### SWING SWANG LANE DEVELOPMENT

Redrow Homes, based locally, have been appointed as the preferred bidder for the Swing Swang Lane site. They gave us feedback on their proposals for developing the site in line with the Hampshire CC brief. This includes a mix of housing with 40% affordable homes, materials and planting, water attenuation against flooding and provision of a footpath along Basing Road, something we have long sought.

Hampshire Highways have indicated that undue pressure on the existing roads once these houses are built is unlikely. However, increased 'Rat Running' along Bartons Lane could be an issue and we will seek to explore this further with Highways.

#### LYCHPIT COMMUNITY HALL

We were pleased to welcome back our regular hirers, including two new groups, at the start of December once the November lockdown period ended. The past year has, unfortunately, proved too difficult for some and we do have space for new groups, particularly during weekdays. Strict protocols are in place to ensure users are as safe as possible so if you are looking for a venue and can comply with Covid regulations, give us a

call. Sadly, it is still not possible to allow party bookings to resume but we are constantly reviewing the regulations and will re-open for children's parties as soon as we are able.





#### **CONSULTATION ON DRAFT VERSION FOR LAND NORTH OF THE M3**

Residents, local community groups, businesses and other organisations are being urged to have their say on a **draft vision for the area north of junction seven of the M3** to help strengthen the final version.

Starting 20th November, the consultation on the draft will run until January 2021.

A number of proposals have been put forward for the area, including it being highlighted as a potential location for a new hospital, a planning application for a distribution hub and land owners putting forward possible development sites for consideration for the **Updated Basingstoke and Deane Local Plan**.

Work is already underway on building new homes on sites allocated in the area in the current **Basingstoke and Deane Local Plan to 2029**, with planning applications approved for others.

Aiming to set out a joined-up-approach to the area, the vision identifies the types of infrastructure needed, for example transport improvements, facilities and utilities.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is already working with highway authorities to move forward the transport strategy for the borough, discussed by councillors on 19th November at the Economic, Planning and Housing Committee. This includes a 21st-century public mass rapid transport system connecting the area to the town centre and bus and railway stations, along with road network improvements, cycle and walking links.

The draft vision highlights areas where investment or more detailed work would be needed, helping other local services to plan ahead in a coordinated way. It aims to put addressing climate change at the heart of future proposals.

Recognising that this area is an important gateway to the town with nearby historic villages with their own distinctive identities, the vision sets out the need to reflect the characteristics of the local environment and the potential concerns of nearby communities. New strategic gaps around villages such as North Waltham and Dummer are proposed.

The aim of the vision is to guide early discussions, helping to set the direction for future planning policy which will emerge as the new Local Plan is developed.

Cabinet Member for Planning Infrastructure and the Natural Environment Cllr Mark Ruffell said: "We want to hear lots of opinions, ideas and comments to make this a shared and joined-up proactive vision for this area. There are so many parts of this, with land owners, residents, groups, other organisations and levels of government involved. We need views on the issues and opportunities for this location in our borough so we can set out our shared ambitions to get the right infrastructure and protection for existing villages and the natural environment."

Based upon comments received and any additional technical evidence available, the vision is set to be updated for adoption by the council's Cabinet in **March 2021**.

#### **VOTING EARLY AT NEXT YEAR'S ELECTIONS**

On **Thursday, 6th May, 2021**, residents in Basingstoke and Deane will go to the **polls** to have their say on who represents them in the Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Hampshire County Council, parish council and Police and Crime Commissioner elections.

While these elections may not be until May, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is already making plans to help residents stay safe while casting their vote and is keen to remind people of the options available to them.

There are a number of ways people can have their say during the elections:

- · vote in a polling station
- by post
- or by appointing someone you trust to vote on your behalf, which is known as a proxy vote

The borough council's electoral registration officer Rebecca Emmett said: "The elections next year will see residents in Basingstoke and Deane voting on who will represent them on the borough council, county council, possibly their parish council and as Police and Crime Commissioner. This is an opportunity for people to have their say and we have already starting planning now so that however residents choose to cast their vote in May, they can do so safely. We are putting arrangements in place to help people stay safe at the polling station but we also want to remind residents that they have the option to vote by post or proxy and applying to do this is very simple."

Residents must be registered to vote to have a say at the elections.

#### **TOUGHER PENALTIES FOR DOG-FOULING OFFENDERS**

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is cracking down on dog owners who fail to clear up after their pet has fouled in a public space by introducing tougher penalties. Anybody caught not cleaning up after their dog has fouled in a public space, or not carrying with them a way of clearing up after their dog, such as dog poo bags, faces an **on-the-spot fine of £100 or a court prosecution**. This is double the previous Fixed Penalty Notice of £50 which could be issued for dog fouling offences.

A borough-wide Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) for dog fouling will enable the tougher penalties to be enforced. It is an offence for dog owners to not clear up after their dog has fouled in a public space and requires they carry an appropriate means to pick up their dog's poo.

The council is reacting to growing concern and numerous complaints from borough residents about an increase in dog fouling in their neighbourhoods. A public consultation on plans to introduce the order saw 97% of the 848 respondents agree that people who fail to pick up after their dogs have fouled is a problem in the borough and supported the proposed powers to deal with this.

Cabinet Member for the Environment and Enforcement Cllr Hayley Eachus said: "We have introduced the Public Space Protection Order across the borough in a bid to eradicate the unsightly and dirty problem of dog fouling and to respond to public concern. The majority of dog owners act responsibly and clear up their pet's mess but there are a minority that still do not and this lazy and selfish behaviour cannot be condoned. We hope these tougher measures, which include a £100 on-the-spot fine and the prospect of prosecution, will act as a deterrent to those owners who do not clear up after their dogs. Residents have told us that clean streets, parks and open spaces is a priority for them and the pandemic has highlighted the importance of these areas in enhancing physical and mental wellbeing. We will continue to work hard to tackle this antisocial and irresponsible behaviour in our borough."

#### **GIFTS**

Dear friends,

As Christmas is cleared away for another year on the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the coming of the wise men to the infant Jesus. And as we think about the wise men, I can't help but think of the old meme that if the three wise men had been three wise women, they would have arrived on time, helped deliver the baby Jesus, brought practical gifts, cleaned the stable and made a casserole.

Scripture, in fact, does not tell us how many wise men there were, but since three gifts are mentioned – gold, frankincense and myrrh – we often talk of three wise men. They are, indeed, unusual gifts to give to a baby, yet each is significant, pointing to Jesus' kingship, divinity and suffering.

Goodness knows what Mary and Joseph thought of it all. If we follow the accounts in the gospels of Luke and Matthew about the birth of Jesus, by the time the wise men turn up Mary and Joseph already know that Jesus is no ordinary child. These extraordinary – and very valuable – gifts can only have strengthened their sense of this.

The word 'gift' has many meanings. Along with physical gifts, we often talk of having gifts, by which we mean talents, skills, aptitudes for certain things. Somebody who possesses many desirable skills in this way might be described as 'gifted'. In the Christian tradition it is emphasised that it is not only the chosen few who possess gifts, but that we all do.

It is also important in the Christian tradition that the gifts we are given are used for the good of others, and that we take time to hone our gifts, to become better and better at using them. In so doing we honour God who, we believe, has given our gifts to each of us.

The new year traditionally means resolutions, attempts to do better at something, or, perhaps, to be a better person, whether that is in relation to something trivial, or something very serious. Perhaps it should also be a time to reflect on the gifts that we each have, a time to take stock, and to look for ways that we might better use these gifts in the weeks, months and years to come. Whatever this year may bring, I pray that we will each flourish in the use of our gifts, and in so doing find joy in all that we do. And so – a joyful and flourishing new year to you all!

#### PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

#### CERVICAL SCREENING

A simple test that can save lives. Cervical screening is one of best ways women aged 25 to 64 can protect themselves from developing cervical cancer. Recent scientific advances mean that today's NHS smear test is much more sensitive and advanced than before.

The smear test is now tested for traces of a virus called Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) which causes nearly all cases of cervical cancer. If HPV is found on a smear test, the test is examined further to look for any changes in the cells taken during the smear. If cell changes are found these can be treated before they get the chance to turn into cervical cancer. This new way of processing smear tests means that cervical screening is even more sensitive and allows us to treat women for early cell changes, way before any evidence of cervical cancer is detected.

So, although the smear test is not something any woman looks forward it really is one that can save lives. The Health Centre's screening programme has been running throughout the pandemic. There are Saturday clinics as well as appointments during the week – please contact reception to book or book online if you are due or overdue your smear test. The test itself takes less than ten minutes and the results usually come back within two weeks, so it really is simple to have peace of mind that you are looking after your health.

Screening invites are sent out every three years to women aged 25 to 49 and every five years to those aged 50 to 64. If you think you have missed an invite or have been putting off going for a smear test, then please do get in touch with the Health Centre. You can find out more about the screening programme at www.nhs.uk/conditions/cervical-screening

#### **OPEN FOR BUSINESS**

The Health Centre is very much open for normal business during this pandemic. Like everywhere else it is having to work differently. **Telephone triage** makes sure patients get seen by the right person, **e-consult** has become very popular and more and more patients are using the **NHS App** to book appointments and request their medication. The now well established COVID precautions are working well at keeping both patients and staff safe from the virus.

The key message from all the doctors and staff is that the most important thing we can all do is to get in touch when we have a concern about our health. It is easier to treat things at an early stage rather than letting them develop into a more serious issue.

#### WI ROCK CAKES

One of our WI Members, **Janice Weeks**, made these rock cakes to sell at our Christmas Fair in December and they were very popular! Janice says "They're very simple". This usually makes 10 to 12 cakes depending on the size you want. You will need:

8 oz self raising flour

4 oz butter

4 oz castor sugar

4 oz sultanas (I wash them)

1 egg

milk

Rub the butter well into the flour until it's light. Mix in the sultanas and sugar.

Beat the egg with about a couple of teaspoons of milk and slowly add, bringing the mixture together by hand. Be careful not to let it get too wet but if it's too dry, you can add a little more milk. (If it's too wet, the cakes will flatten and won't be "rock" cakes – but they're still good to eat!).

On a baking tray lined with greaseproof, separate the mixture into little cakes using two forks and poke any sultanas on the top in a bit so that they hopefully don't get burnt. Bake in a fan oven at 190 degrees C for about 12 to 15 minutes, but keep an eye on them.



#### **OUR SERVICES**

#### **OUR LOCKDOWN ONE MEMBERS SURVEY RESULTS**

Driving force behind the new support group is addressing the needs identified by the survey which BDDF conducted to understand the impact of the lockdown on disabled people. Top three three challenges faced by our disabled community were: 1. Psychological distress/mental health (50%); 2. Social isolation and loneliness (45%); 3. Difficulties accessing NHS healthcare and treatment (35%).

Our survey results highlighted digital exclusion of the disabled and some of our older generation was adding to isolation. Aim of the session is to ensure they can be involved in online activities and keep in contact with friends and loved ones if isolating, by teaching how to get online and how to use Zoom. Many commented on our survey what they really want right now is a call, a friendly voice on the other end of the line. We currently have three wonderful volunteers calling our members and making a difference to their day. If you know someone who is isolated or lonely who would like to hear from us please let us know.

#### **JANUARY IN YOUR GARDEN**

You never can be sure what the weather is going to be like, whether we will get a repeat of the 'Beasts From The East" from past winters or not, but if we do, be prepared to be on constant snow patrol, especially if you have large coniferous trees or a greenhouse, snow must be brushed or knocked off as soon as possible to avoid damage due to be excessive weight.

But let's think positively. The cold weather will not come as harshly as recent winters, and we will be able to get out into the garden. There is much planting to be done, Raspberries, Gooseberries and currants can be planted, as well as Roses, so long as the soil isn't frozen or too waterlogged.

If you are thinking of growing peas this year, and would like them earlier than usual, place a cloche over the soil to allow it to warm up (tip: if you had a real Christmas tree, the stripped down branches can make an excellent pea support).

The most pleasing course of action is of course to stay inside where it is warm! If you need an excuse to do so, turn your mind to browsing the seed catalogues and online shops. As well as the usual varieties, why not have a look for some more exotic or newer species. Pluots are a mixture between a Plum and an Apricot, and do well in the south of England. Self-fertile varieties are available too. If you're feeling adventurous try a Medlar tree. Medlars are ornamental, flowering trees with pretty blossom, good autumn colour and fruits which are edible, although not to everyone's taste. Their fruit is tart if eaten raw, but makes pleasantly flavoured jellies or can be used in desserts. Left to soften the fruit mellows and is a traditional, if unusual, treat.

If you are lucky enough to have an electric propagator then plant Tomatoes, Aubergines, Chillies and other crops that need a long hot growing season, providing you have an indoor area that receives a lot of light to pot onto. Keeping them starved of light as they grow will result in leggy, useless plants.

For houseplants, reduce watering now as plants aren't growing much, and leaves don't lose moisture in cool conditions, all you need to do is keep plants just moist, and there is no need to feed plants until March.

#### **OLD BASING ALLOTMENT AND GARDEN SOCIETY (OBAGS)**

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 situation the shop will remain in hibernation until at least March because of the logistical problems with protecting volunteers from the virus. In addition, the decision was made not to proceed with the date for our AGM due to the problems of meeting. So we will be calling **Special General Meeting** once it is safe to do so. In the meantime, this year's activities such as correspondence, memberships, sales figures and a profit and loss account from our treasurer have been uploaded to the website **www.obags.uk** 

Top tasks for January are to contiue harvesting winter brassicas, keep spreading manure of compost over empty beds and prune any establisged apple and pear trees that haven't already been tackled. You can also buy and chit your seed potatoes and work out your sowing plan for this year.

#### **NATURE NOTES FOR JANUARY**

I do hope you all had a wonderful Christmas, as far it was allowed, and that you perhaps enjoyed your own Boxing Day walk seeing as the organised event had to be shelved. We probably all view 2021 with some trepidation but let's stary positive (but tested negative!!) that we will kick Covid into the very long grass.

Talking of long grass, I encountered plenty of that this week (3rd December) on the resumption of the pheasant season where I 'beat' for the local shoot. I appreciate that it's a hobby that might not appeal to everyone especially when conditions were resembling the monsoons of the Far East, as per yesterday, but the ability to walk in areas off the beaten track and see wildlife that might be otherwise missed, is brilliant.

Yesterday's event whilst a slog in the pouring rain, didn't prevent two Woodcock, several Snipe and a Barn Owl from being temporarily flushed from whatever cover they were taking at the time. Certainly, I haven't personally seen a Woodcock for perhaps 50 years but the quick flight and long downward pointing bill was unmistakable. There would have been a time once when this gamebird would have been a target but not these days as people that participate in the sport are very aware of the frailties of certain species numbers.

So, whilst pursuing their love of country sports they also help to fund the management of the countryside, maintaining and restoring conditions for birds like the Woodcock to recover.

The inevitable cold weather means that our feathered friends rely on us to not only keep them fed and watered until the spring but also to provide shelter, especially very small birds. **Terry McAnish** has a camera box and sent me this photo of a **Blue Tit** snuggled down for the night (see right), apparently arriving at 4.30pm each afternoon and staying til gone 7am. As Terry said, 'It gets more sleep than I do'!





Many thanks also to **Nick Harris** in Milkingpen Lane who

sent me this great photo of a literal charm of **Goldfinches** on his seed feeder (see left) and this looks like the sort of picture that one might see on a publicity advert for a Bird Feeder company, so good is it!

The cold snap has also produced reports of numbers of Redwings now moving in and feasting on plump red berries on Holly, Pyracanthus and Cotaneaster. Unfortunately wood pigeons are also partial to these and although I know I shouldn't deny them 'their right' to feed on these, most of us I'm sure you'll agree want to see 'good birds' like Mistle

Thrushes, Redwings and Waxwings. Expect to see lots of Blackbirds too, many of which will also have come over the Channel from colder mainland Europe.

And anyway, if they come now they'll avoid the passport queues from 1st January! Happy New Year to you all.

#### WILD WINTER LARDERS

The sight of your fridge or cupboards full after a trip to the shops can be very satisfying, but did you know humans aren't the only ones who like to keep a well-stocked larder over the winter months? All sorts of animals have been

hiding food away, ready to eat in the depths of winter when other food sources get scarce.

#### IN THE WOODS

Some of the first animals that we might think of when we hear the words 'winter larder' are squirrels. These furry mammals hide high-fat food in a scattered fashion, either burying their hoard or stuffing it into hollows in trees. Their stash often includes nutritious meals like acorns and hazelnuts, but red squirrels have also been seen keeping fungi in dry spots between branches to eat later. Squirrels hide so much food in preparation for winter that they inadvertently help woodlands to grow, with many of the forgotten seeds germinating in spring.

Looking to our feathered friends, acorns are also a firm favourite with jays. They cache their food in a similar way to squirrels, scattering it throughout the forest and often forgetting some of the piles. If not buried or hidden well, their stores may be eaten by mice before the jays ever get the chance.

#### **UNDER THE GROUND**

Perhaps more unexpectedly, some British subterranean species also keep food stores in winter. Moles keep stores of earthworms at this time of year, in preparation for the ground freezing and becoming too hard to feed. A mole's storage method is rather gruesome; they bite the heads of worms, immobilising them and then keep their meal in chambers off their tunnels. In areas where flooding is likely the moles might also store their prey in a 'fortress' above ground. Some worms have a lucky escape, if they haven't been eaten by the time the weather warms up, they can heal their heads and tunnel their way out.

Helping wildlife stock up for winter can be really simple. Putting out food for birds and letting your garden grow wild, with log and rock piles provides food and places for wildlife to wait out the cold.


