Any organisation which uses and stores personal information, and the *Basinga* does this when accepting emailed 'copy' and enquiries, must ensure the security and integrity of its stored data.

Our secure website forms have been available for some time and are our preferred means of receiving information. The submission forms can be found at www.basinga.org.uk in the drop-down menus on the main page labelled "CONTRIBUTOR SUBMISSIONS". Diary dates can be passed to us and articles/letters attached in the same way as using an email. From the same menu bar you can submit Free Ads, Concession Ads (What's On) and make enquiries about paid-for advertising. We also need to draw your attention to our Privacy Policy, this and any other changes will be displayed on the website.

We are more than happy if you want to try out the website forms to get used to them, just put "Test Message" in the name field and complete your email address, you will then get a conformation of receipt.

Using the website as a means of contacting us ensures that contributions and enquiries are directed to the most appropriate of our volunteers, cuts down on our time and provides us with a more efficient system.

NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

The school summer holidays are the ideal time to visit Basing House. The site is more than ruins – we have 14 acres of grassland, a nature trail and a walled garden as well. **And with tickets now lasting a year, repeat visits are free.** We also have some family activities planned.

Nature becomes our theme on **Thursday, 26th July**, when **Hampshire & Isle Of Wight Wildlife Trust (HIWWR)** staff are in attendance. In the morning they help visitors explore the Basing House meadows and learn about the butterflies and other bugs that live in this habitat. Sweep nets and bug pots can be used to catch and identify a range of species. In the afternoon there is a beginners' session to learn how to identify wildflowers which will help you to learn the basics by focusing on plant families and their characteristics. By the end of the session you should be able to identify a number of common grassland plants. There is an additional fee for these events.

On **Tuesday, 31st July**, you can join our fun, friendly family clay workshop and create some unique pieces from air-dry clay to take home. What will yours be...a fairy door or an entrance to a monster's lair?

Meanwhile our **Thursday craft mornings** continue through **July** and **August**, as do our **Tuesday** and **Thursday guided tours**. There is also a **craft course** – **spinner rings**, which includes some silversmithing on **Wednesday**, **25th July**. We'll also open the **tunnel** and **dig pits**, where children can learn basic archaeological techniques, in **August**.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - REFERENDUM UPDATE

Thank you to all residents who voted on **7th June** – the result of the referendum was a resounding **YES** to the **Neighbourhood Plan**. This will now go to a **meeting of the Borough Council** on **19th July** for the Plan to be "made". *See also bottom of the page*.

COUNCILLOR RESIGNATION

It is with considerable regret that we say **goodbye** to **Cllr Sven Godesen** who has served as a Parish Councillor and former Chairman for more than 12 years but has decided, due to health issues, to step down from the Parish Council. He will, however, continue to represent residents as a Borough Councillor and member of the Development Control Committee.

Cllr Godesen's resignation leaves a **vacancy for a Parish Councillor** to represent **Old Basing** and anyone wishing to put their name forward for co-option should email the Clerk. If you are unsure as to whether this role is right for you, now is a good time as all Councillors will stand for re-election next May so you need only commit until then before deciding whether or not to continue.

TESCO BAGS OF HELP

The Parish Council's application to this scheme for funds to install an item of **Special Needs Outdoor Fitness Equipment** on the **Recreation Ground** has been successful and the project will be put forward for customer votes during July and August. Participating stores are the main Chineham Tesco, Tesco Express at Lychpit and the Basingstoke Tesco Metro. Tokens are not always handed out automatically so please ASK each time you shop at any of these stores and place your vote.



APPEAL LAUNCHED TO SAVE INTERNATIONALLY IMPORTANT 18TH-CENTURY HAMPSHIRE TAPESTRIES

Six of the most important tapestries in the National Trust's collection are leaving their home at The Vyne for a 'bath' in Belgium. The 18th-century 'chinoiserie' tapestries urgently need extensive conservation work. Historic repairs have begun to fail and the tapestries' backings have warped, putting strain on the fragile fabric. The work will cost the charity in the region of £382,000, and The Vyne has launched an urgent appeal to help fund the project, and ensure the magnificent tapestries can continue to be enjoyed by visitors to The Vyne.

In **June** the textiles travelled to the **Royal Manufacturers De Wit** in **Belgium** – the world's leading restorer of tapestries. There, they will undergo a process known as 'wet cleaning', before returning to the UK for major conservation treatment, estimated to take three years. 'Wet cleaning' will see the tapestries laid out on a 'suction table' whilst a mist of mild detergent is gently drawn through the historic fabric to remove any dirt. After cleaning, the tapestries will be laid out and covered with cloth to absorb the moisture. Once dried, they will be carefully rolled up and transported back to the UK.

The conservation project has received some financial support from the National Trust. However with a total of 250,000 hectares of countryside, 778 miles of coastline and hundreds of special places across England, Wales and Northern Ireland to look after, the Trust must look to the generosity of its supporters to meet the shortfall. To enable the conservation project to go ahead, The Vyne has launched an **urgent appeal** to raise the **remaining £35,000**. Visitor Experience and Fundraising Manager Hollie Ryan explains: "It's really easy to support conservation efforts like The Vyne's Tapestry Project. You can donate remotely by phoning **01256 883858** or you can make a **contribution during your visit**."

Raffle tickets are currently on sale at The Vyne with a top prize of £10,000. Young families can also lend a helping hand and have fun at the same time by tackling the Lost tapestries trail on their visit for a suggested donation of £1 plus normal admission. UK taxpayers can make their donation go even further by adding Gift Aid.

DISCOVER YOUR WILD MEADOWS

Summer is by far the best time of year for exploring your **local meadow**. Now wild flowers are blooming, butterflies are on the wing, grasshoppers are singing and birds are raising young. In most of the UK, meadows came about through people felling forests thousands of years ago, and subsequently grazing livestock over many centuries. Meadows are a habitat maintained – and prevented from becoming something else – by the activity of humans and our livestock.

Since these habitats were largely shaped by centuries of grazing, conservation organisations continue the same management today. It is only through management of scrub and trees that we can maintain the open diversity of these wonderful habitats. Meadows are therefore also great places to look out for our native livestock species.

The **Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust's** management of meadows is supported by an army of cows and sheep, who keep the scrub at bay, and maintain the open habitat that sunloving flowers and invertebrates love. Why not discover your local meadow this weekend and see what amazing meadow species you can spot on your patch.

Meadow Buttercup

Meadow buttercup is one of our iconic buttercup species. It's often found in meadows and pastures, but also in parks, gardens and woodland edges. It flowers between April and October, and forms yellow meadows much loved by bees and butterflies that dazzle in the sunshine.

Skylark

Male skylarks sing in flight as well as from perches such as fence posts or large rocks. Despite their aerial activities, skylarks nest on the ground, laying three to four eggs. If seen singing, the Skylark is unmistakeable. A streaky brown bird with a crest, the skylark is larger, with a longer tail, than other similar birds. The song of the skylark has been the subject of many works of literature and music, from Chaucer to Shelley, Vaughan Williams to jazz.

Field Grasshopper

Grasshoppers can be found thanks to the males' song, created by rubbing their legs against their wings. Field grasshoppers are one of our commonest species, and their song is a brief, single chirrup, repeated at short intervals.

Meadow Brown

The meadow brown is one of the commonest grassland butterflies, though whole colonies have been lost as a result of agricultural practices in recent years. They can be seen from June to September – look out for mainly brown butterflies with washed-out orange patches on the forewings.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust is one of 46 Wildlife Trusts working across the UK. With the invaluable support of volunteers and members they manage over 50 nature reserves. They also work with other organisations and landowners to protect and connect wildlife sites across the county and inspire local communities and young people to care for wildlife where they live.

EVENT NEWS

On **Saturday, 7th July**, as part of the **Fun Day** at **Bartons Mill Pub** we shall be holding our annual **Duck Race (from 1.30pm)** to raise funds to enable us to maintain the field to the benefit of you, the users and the abundant wildlife that abounds on this Local Nature Reserve. **Tickets** will be on **sale in advance at Bartons Mill** or **on the day**.

However, money alone only covers our administration costs, such as insurance and tools. What keeps the field in trim is time and effort from a small team of volunteers over the winter series of **maintenance sessions**. These **sessions** are **two hours on a weekend morning, from 10am to noon**, with a coffee break. We would love it if Mill Field dog walkers could come along and help one Saturday or Sunday this winter - its just two hours – just one session – that's just four dog walks of your time.

Our second event for July is a **Guided Walk around the Mill Field Local Nature Reserve**. This will be on **Wednesday**, **11th July**, starting from the **play area** by **Bartons Mill** at **7.30pm**. Do join us if you can for what will be a fascinating tour of the birds, butterflies and plants in the field. As ever, everyone is most welcome.

WHAT'S AROUND THIS MONTH

July is a vibrant month for the wildlife in the field; Parent Goldfinch will be carrying food back to feed their young in the nest and Whitethroats will be stalking around the scrub. During the day the stream is a popular spot for Swallows and House Martins swooping in on flying insects whilst visitors later in the evening will see an increase in the number of bats on the wing. Our butterflies and moths are recovering in numbers so look out for daytime moths such as the Silver Y and the Burnet, distinctive for its red spots on black wings. Those looking for plants in July will find the Bee and Common Spot orchids, as well as the flowering of the towering Woolly thistle.

PROBUS VISITS EXBURY GARDENS

Thursday, 7th June, saw 31 souls consisting of members, wives, lady friends and some from the Ladies Probus Club of Basingstoke having a splendid trip by coach to **Exbury Gardens**. Situated at the southern end of the New Forest and adjacent to the Beaulieu River the property was bought by the de Rothschild family in 1918. During WWII the house was used by General Eisenhower, Churchill and General Montgomery to plan the D Day landings. It has been a lifetime's work for several generations of the de Rothschild family in creating one of the finest woodland gardens in the country extending over 250 acres. The gardens also include a narrow-gauge steam railway conceived in 2,000 and taking over two years to construct. It was the dream of Leopald de Rothschild, who had been denied a model railway as a boy. It had been hoped that the rhododendrons would still be in bloom but this year's spring weather put paid to that, although there were a few late varieties still in flower. The group had a guided tour while some less mobile used a golf buggy complete with informative driver. The afternoon encouraged a ride on the steam train which took in parts of the garden not accessible on foot. Living the life of a vicar is a terrifically humbling experience. One is invited into many of the most painful, as well as many of the most joyful experiences of people's lives. One is present at life's beginning and it's ending. One can end up going straight from the deathbed of a well-loved friend to a roomful of happy schoolchildren. One shares others' stories and their doubts. One sees children grow from infants being baptised into garrulous children in the playground. And all the time one turns to God in prayer, hoping that he will fill the gap between what one can offer and what others deserve.

It is easy to take for granted that the place where one lives is a community in the truest sense. Busy and active, friendly and supportive. But, in truth, it is only because enough people care about the institutions that help it to be that way – the schools, clubs, societies, the local government, and, yes, the church – and are prepared to do the hard donkey work that lies behind them – the committees, the chores, the maintenance and the heavy lifting – that we can have opportunities to come together and live a full life alongside each other. We are fortunate, and I am fortunate to have lived in a place where those people have been in plentiful supply, and to have been a part of this village.

And so, at **10am** on **Sunday** the **22nd of July** I shall take my **last service at St Mary's**, and bid a fond farewell to this community and its people, before returning to the army as a chaplain once again – a vocation I left behind six years ago, but which has never ceased to make a claim on me.

I can look back on my time here with immense gratitude due, in large measure, to the big-hearted generosity I have met with from so many of the people in this place. Inevitably, in a role like this it feels that one receives so much more than one is ever able to give.



JULY IN YOUR GARDEN

I have recently planted a Yuzu tree. Yuzu is an Asian citrus famed for its intense flavour. It has had somewhat of a surge in popularity over the last few years with Western culture jumping on the bandwagon regarding not only the flavour but also the health benefits associated with it.

From a gardening perspective, it is a frost-hardy citrus that can be planted in the ground. My variety is hardy down to minus 5°C, and has been placed in a sheltered spot in full to partial shade. Cold winds can strip it of its leaves so it is important to protect it with fleece, and it demands a sandy, well-draining soil, but so far it seems to be very happy.

The reason I write this is because for years Yuzu trees were hard to come by, and then they needed to be treated like other citrus trees, and taken indoors in winter. Only specialist companies imported them, at a hefty price, but now most companies stock them. The same is true for other more exotic trees – pomegranates are becoming more available for example. It is worth looking at catalogues all year round for inspiration and new things to try.

Onwards to the work for the month! As you may imagine there is so much to be getting on with.

Hanging baskets should be in the height of their display, but cutting back growth can encourage new flowers and revive any flagging displays but be sure you that feed your baskets well after doing this.

Cut back hardy Geraniums and Delphiniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage new growth and further blooms. Lupins can also be pruned to prompt new flowers, also water daily in dry weather. Roses look best for being deadheaded; unless your Rose produces attractive hips come the autumn, in which case leave them on. Definitely dead head sweet peas, as this encourages new growth and the peas produced aren't edible. As for hollyhock to stop rust damaging the foliage prune out affected leaves and/or spray with a fungicide.

It is probably time to stop harvesting Rhubarb stalks now, the plant needs time to recover and I'm sure you're now completely fed up with rhubarb crumble!

If you've trained your apples and pears as cordons, fans or espaliers, give them their summer prune now to maintain a good shape. Cherry, Plum and Peach trees can do with a summer prune now to avoid them getting silver leaf disease. Blackcurrants also like a summer prune once they have fruited.

In the vegetable garden you can plant second cropping potatoes to give you new potatoes for Christmas. Plant these in pots or bags so they can be brought under cover before the first frosts. As for tomatoes remember to pinch out side shoots each week and cut off any leaves growing below the lowest ripening fruit trusses to improve air circulation and prevent diseases. You can boost your tomato crop by feeding them with dilute tomato fertiliser once a week; if leaves look pale and yellow feed more regularly. With cucumber make sure you train the stems upwards instead of trailing over the ground, making most of the space available, tying in their long stems to vertical wires or a wigwam of poles.

If we do get some prolonged fine weather, cast your mind to fence panels, sheds, garden furniture and anything else that might need painting or preserving.

Like I say, hopefully the weather will be fine and warm and we can make the most of our gardens, the summer months will soon be gone sadly, so do make sure you find time to get out and enjoy your garden!

NATURE NOTES FOR JULY

It was widely reported that the month of May was the warmest and sunniest since records began and we all certainly noticed that. In previous years there inevitably seemed to be a cold and wet spell between the 20th and 30th of May, resulting in a grave shortage of insect and caterpillars, just when many nesting box broods would be hatching. The result was that the Blue, Coal and Great Tits particularly suffered poor breeding seasons and barely maintained their numbers. This year however there must have been a boom, if the success in our own garden was anything to go by, with two boxes being occupied and successfully fledging broods of Coal and Blue Tits. Before they emerged we had numerous baby birds around the place all gaping for food from overworked parents so our fat-ball and insect-impregnated suet offerings were all gratefully received. In fact all the feeders were emptied within days and were more popular than in the depths of winter! A Great Spotted Woodpecker visited every day and then she turned up with a youngster last week. Sarah Green down the road had two young GSWs in her garden earlier in the month so this species seems to have done well.

The low-flying and food scrap-hunting antics of the local Kites would indicate youngsters are also being fed somewhere locally and Ross Needs in Belle Vue sent me two cracking photos of these majestic birds overhead. These are on **Basinga Extra** web pages.

Terry McAnish sent a couple of photos in of young Blue Tits, eight in total, just out of their home in his garden, managing to avoid the attentions of Magpies and Jays that would be eager to benefit from the tasty bonanza briefly on offer. Terry also mentioned hearing a Cuckoo on 21st May 21 as did we here on the same day so one assumes it was working his way along the old canal looking for a warbler or pipit nest for his mate to lay her egg in. That is the first one I've heard for many years and there weren't many reports other than these, Margaret Chewters at Huish and Tony Stoney's encounter with one near Fordingbridge.

Migrants have been very late in arriving with few Swallows, House Martins or Swifts getting here in May and early June as is the norm. BBC's *Springwatch* even commented on this so it seems a national trend which is really worrying. So is it habitat loss, global warming or mass predation by humans or otherwise in Africa, who knows? It was good therefore to get a call from Christine Stuart in Lambs Row who spied about a dozen Swifts whizzing around that area on 18th May with more arriving on the 21st. That was a warm week and it encouraged an influx because that was our first sight of Martins overhead here also.

I'm never happy to find my flower beds polluted by cat poo but the hedgehog droppings found this week were a weirdly pleasing sight. Let me know if you find some too!
