PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH AWARD

Due to COVID restrictions there was no Annual Parish Award in 2020 and the Parish Council made a donation to the Basingstoke Food Bank in its place. The past year has, however, highlighted the many public-spirited people in our Parish who have gone out of their way to help friends and neighbours and we would like to hear from you if you wish to nominate someone to receive the award during 2021 which will be presented later in the year. Nominees from previous years who have not previously received the award will automatically be considered.

SCHOOL PARKING

At long last the yellow lines along sections of Milkingpen Lane, around the schools, have been painted and it is hoped this will improve traffic flow along this part of the village and that parents dropping off children at school will respect the restrictions.

We have also been made aware of similar problems in Ivar Gardens by parents parking to drop their children at Binfields School and understand from County Councillor, Elaine Still, that HCC Highways also have plans to put parking restrictions in place there, hopefully during 2021 subject to funding being available.

HOUSING THREAT

Those who have read the Parish Council's Community Newsletter will be aware that the threat of more houses being built on sites east of Old Basing and the Loddon Valley is still very real. The Parish Council will continue to oppose any further development in this area and continues to put pressure on the Borough Council to progress the already agreed development of Manydown.

Any support from residents to help fight the destruction of the Loddon Valley would be welcome so if you feel you can help, if only to offer your support for the Parish Council's stance, please email or write to the Parish Council.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY

At its meeting in June the Parish Council agreed its initial response to the Climate Emergency and will publish details in the Autumn Community Newsletter due to be distributed in September. An outline of these plans will also published on this page of the Basinga.

To achieve its aims the Council will need to involve the community generally so if you feel you may have skills that would be useful please look out for the article and, when the time comes, contact the Parish Office.





ODIHAM & OLD BASING HEALTH CENTRE PARTICIPATION GROUP

You have probably seen the news coverage of how busy GPs are now and our Practice is experiencing exactly the same pressures.

The key message from the surgery is that they really want patients to come forward if they have worries and concerns about their health. Putting things off can often lead to more serious issues.

For those people who need medical attention on the same day the telephone triage system makes sure that those who need to be seen in person get access to a doctor. It also ensures that the surgeries can maintain social distancing measures so that all patients and staff stay safe.

All of us who are comfortable with using technology can help by using the various online options rather than simply phoning the Practice. This means that the phone lines are available for those who need quick attention. You can book appointments, view test results, and access your own medical records via the Practice online services and the NHS App.

One of the on-line services, e-consult, has really taken off over the last year. The service is easy to use, and you will get a response within 48 hours either by email, text or a call from a doctor.

The pandemic has transformed the way our GPs have to work – we cannot imagine any of them envisaged doing video consultations 12 months ago but now they are a regular occurrence. It has also meant that as patients we are having to learn new ways of getting the advice and help we need.

The purpose of the Patient Participation Group is to work collaboratively with the Practice to help improve services through feedback and sharing patient interests and concerns. As we emerge from the pandemic and the NHS looks to future ways of working this is going to be even more important. Dear friends,


One of the things that has been apparent over the last year is the generosity of the people of Old Basing and Lychpit, whether it is supporting the foodbank (via the box on the Vicarage porch), sharing items outside houses for others to collect, or generously giving of time to help one another, it's heartening to see and experience.

As children we are sometimes taught that to give something away is to have less, but as we grow up we begin to grasp that giving what we have to help others does not diminish us, but instead benefits us the giver as well as the receiver. It leaves us feeling warm and happy to be able to share with others. Generosity is therefore a double gift, one that benefits receiver and giver.

For Christians, any act of generosity, given freely and unconditionally, without expectation or strings attached is an opportunity to participate in the love of God, and can help to draw us closer to God. At the heart of Christian theology is the concept of the grace of God. This idea means, in essence, that God is overwhelmingly generous and entirely selfless in God's love for creation. Generosity therefore becomes not only a double gift, but a triple gift: one that benefits receiver and giver and draws us closer to God.

Whether this is your belief or not, generosity still takes on a life of its own, for the truly generous act has a way of generating good feeling for the receiver as well as the giver. Moreover, it can spark a chain of generosity. For really overwhelming generosity has a way of making the recipient desire to act with generosity in response, not because they have to, but because it feels good. Why not try a random act of generosity this month and see what happens?

BERYL MULLENDER (1937–2021)

We are sad to report that long-term Old Basing resident, community servant and Basingstoke's Unsung Hero Award winner, **Beryl Mullender**, has sadly passed away unexpectedly, aged **83**.

Together with her husband Michael, Beryl first moved into Old Basing with their young son to a 'new build' house in Holly Drive in 1962. At that point Fairthorne Rise was just open fields!

Beryl was a stalwart supporter of the Old Basing and Basingstoke community with extensive service to the Scout and Guide Associations over 65 years. While she was Guide Leader for the Old Basing troop Beryl gained renown for taking them on walks through the village calling out "come on girls!" to keep up the pace. Never one for doing things by halves, Beryl maintained her lengthy walks to the end, covering circular routes around the village as her 'permitted exercise' during lockdown. After all, why pop to the local shop at the end of the road if you can turn this into a 'proper walk'!

BASINGSTOKE'S NEW MAYOR

"A tremendous honour" is how **Basingstoke and Deane's new Mayor, Clir Onnalee Cubitt** views her forthcoming year in office. Clir Cubitt, who represents Basing and Upton

Grey ward, was made Mayor on **27th May** at the annual Council meeting held at The

Haymarket, owing to COVID restrictions on the number able to fit in the Council Chamber.

Having served two years as Deputy Mayor, following Cllr Taylor's Mayoral term being extended in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, Cllr Cubitt is looking forward to getting out and about to meet as many borough residents and businesses as possible, in line with guidelines, as restrictions ease and lift.

This year, the new Mayor and her Consort, her husband Hugo Cubitt DL, hope to be able to resume many of the annual events on the Mayoral calendar in person, rather than online.

She said: "I am very excited to become Mayor of this wonderful borough and celebrate all that it has to offer, especially after the difficulties of the pandemic. It will feel extra special to attend events and ceremonies in person and meet people, one of the pleasures that we will no longer take for granted."

The Mayor's Charity Appeal 2021/22 supports two local good causes – The Community Furniture Project and The Friends of St Michael's Hospice.

Since the early 1990s, Cllr Cubitt has been involved in helping to raise funds for St Michael's Hospice. The Friends of St. Michael's Hospice's fundraising contributes towards maintaining the excellent standard of palliative care for which the hospice is renowned.

Described by Cllr Cubitt as "simply amazing", The Community Furniture Project gives a new life to unwanted furniture, appliances, bicycles and household goods, selling them to raise money, as well as providing at low cost or free to those in need. The project gives local people with learning disabilities or mental health conditions the opportunity to train and gain new skills.

Cllr Cubitt has been a board member of Loddon Social Enterprise Ltd for over 12 years. The charity provides a safe working environment for adults with learning disabilities. She was also a local education authority governor of Dove House School, an outstanding local special educational needs secondary school, for a number of years before it became an academy.

The Mayor is also hoping to use the year to encourage more adults to volunteer to support the army, air, sea, police and St John Ambulance cadet groups. Cllr Cubitt has seen what a difference the cadet movements can make to young people, helping them to develop life skills, such as problem solving and teamwork. She is keen that the current lack of volunteers doesn't stop more young people having the chance to benefit.

Cllr Cubitt was raised in Weston Patrick and has spent most of her life in Basingstoke and Deane. She has been a borough councillor since 2008 and lives in Up Nately. The couple have two children, Billy, aged 21, and Summer, 19, who are both studying at universities in Oxford.

After leaving school, Cllr Cubitt was a voluntary worker in Sri Lanka, teaching English and Mathematics in an orphanage in Moratuwa. Cllr Cubitt holds a joint Anglo-French BA Hons degree in European Business Studies and a Diplome d'Ecole Superieure de Commerce de Reims, ESC Reims. She joined Standard Chartered Bank as a graduate trainee in 1988

and spent the next 14 years based in London in international finance. She also worked for a couple of other banks before returning to Standard Chartered Bank in 1997 to be Head of Loan Syndications, running a multi-national team covering Africa, the Middle East, the Indian sub-continent and Europe.

She met her Hampshire-born husband Hugo by the shores of Lough Dan in the Wicklow Mountains. In 2001, Onnalee and Hugo moved to Basingstoke and Deane and founded a local building company specialising in period properties. The couple have been extensively involved with fundraising for a number of charities over the years, including St Michael's Hospice and the Army Benevolent Fund. They also raised £550,000 for the Piam Brown Ward, the children's cancer ward in University Hospital Southampton, where their daughter Summer spent three years being treated for T Cell Lymphoblastic Lymphoma.

The Deputy Mayor for Basingstoke and Deane 2021/22 is Cllr Paul Miller and the Deputy Mayoress is his wife Sandra.

BROADHURST GROVE AND SAXON WAY

Areas of communal space at **Broadhurst Grove** and **Saxon Way**, in Old Basing, are to be considered for **Local Green Space designation**, as part of the council's Basingstoke and Deane Local Plan update. Both locations are privately owned public open space which are already protected from redevelopment by the green infrastructure policy contained in the adopted Basingstoke and Deane Local Plan. Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is in the early stages of updating its local plan and is considering the introduction of a Local Green Space policy which would enable communities to identify and protect green areas of particular importance to them. The local plan is the key document that guides how planning applications are determined, including setting out how the environment of the borough will be protected and enhanced and where different kinds of development will be allowed or not allowed. Extensive work to update it in the coming months will include public consultation.

The open spaces in Broadhurst Grove and Saxon Way were put forward for protection through the council's Issues and Options consultation as the first step in updating the local plan, held in autumn 2020, by Old Basing and Lychpit Parish Council. If designated, they would be afforded a high level of protection in the planning system, consistent with green belts. Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's Cabinet Member for Communities, Planning and Infrastructure Cllr Simon Bound said: "I am pleased to report that both Broadhurst Grove and Saxon Way have been put forward for consideration as Local Green Spaces as part of the Local Plan Update. I hope that this will bring some reassurance to the residents who have enjoyed using the space for a number of years."

The council has begun assessing all of the land promoted for Local Green Space designation against national policy and principles. The result of these assessments will be published as part of the draft Local Plan Update consultation, which is due to take place in early 2022. This consultation will provide an opportunity for all relevant landowners to make representations about proposed designations. The Local Plan Update is due for adoption in 2024.

SPECIAL MAYORAL VISIT FOR CIVIL WAR COMPETITION WINNERS

Winners of an English Civil War Arts and Poetry Competition, inspired by the Battle of Basing House in 1645, have been presented with prizes by the new Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane.

The competition, organised by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Hampshire Cultural Trust and Hampshire County Council, invited students in the borough to produce a piece of artwork, music or a poem relating to the battle at Basing House, which was besieged and destroyed by Oliver Cromwell and his army.

Pupils have been learning the history of Basing House, which was the last Royalist stronghold in the south east and a key site in the battle between King and Parliament at the end of the English Civil War.

The winners were chosen from a huge number of competition entries, including submissions by young people from local primary schools, secondary schools and sixth form colleges, by the former Mayor Cllr Diane Taylor and Alan Turton, a former curator at Basing House, author and Civil War expert.

Mayor Cllr Onnalee Cubitt was joined at Basing House by her Consort Hugo Cubitt, special guest Alan Turton and his wife Nicola and Helen Sinnamon, Schools Manager (Milestones Museum and Basing House) at Hampshire Cultural Trust.

The winners received an engraved plaque from the Mayor and an annual family pass to Basing House, one of the borough's most popular historical attractions. In addition, both of the winners' year groups will enjoy a free educational visit to Basing House, including a guided tour by Alan Turton. All winners and finalists were presented with a commemorative certificate for their creative achievement. They were:

Cllr Cubitt said: "The English Civil War project in borough schools has given pupils a greater insight into the fascinating history of Basing House and the competition was originally launched to mark the 375th anniversary of the Battle of Basing House last year. As my first engagement since becoming the Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane, I was pleased to meet the winners of the competition and to talk about their winning entries which were so imaginative and really conjured up a sense of local history, bringing the siege and final battle of Basing House to life."

Secondary and Sixth Form category winner Charlie Bowden added: "It was great to be able to come together to appreciate the work of all the finalists and learn more about the history of Basing House by exploring the site of the ruins, and I felt very proud and grateful to receive the certificate and plaque for my work."

Alan Turton said: "It was a great pleasure to be involved in this project and a delight to meet the winners and know that they have been prompted to think deeply about the English Civil War, which was such a crucial and formative part of our national and local history."

It is enjoyable at all levels and you don't need to be an athlete to play it. There is an excellent facility in Basingstoke with a top class lawn and a cosy clubhouse.

JULY IN YOUR GARDEN

June has been "flaming" and hopefully by the time you are reading this the hot weather has continued. If so, being water wise will be the order of the month. Using water butts, trying to only water pots and new plants if dry and keeping bird baths and ponds clean and topped up should all be priorities.

Unless in drought, lawns should be mown regularly. Setting the blades slightly higher can protect the grass in very hot weather, but any brown patches will soon recover once autumn rains return. Try to only use a sprinkler if absolutely necessary. Ants and weeds will probably be your biggest problems right now, so brush off the former and spot treat or dig out the latter. The growing rate of the grass will slow towards the end of summer so setting a higher blade height then will make the grass more resistant to wear.

Summer baskets can be kept looking at their best if they are cut back and then fed. This can encourage new growth and revive their display. Deadhead flower borders and cut back hardy geraniums and delphiniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage more blooms.

You can propagate your own flowers by starting to collect seed heads and by taking cuttings of container and patio plants. Feeding and mulching borders will really help encourage a good display as well as retaining moisture, reducing the need to water and will also suppress weeds. It is probably the best thing you can do for your garden right now. The best mulches are 5 to 7cm thick and are rich in organic matter.

Evergreen hedges such as Lonicera nitada, Box and Privet can be clipped this month and the clippings added to the compost heap if they aren't too woody. Once Clematis Montana has finished flowering, it can be cut back – hard if necessary. Honeysuckle and climbing roses will need tying in to their supports, the latter need to be tied as horizontal as possible to ensure the best showing of flowers. If you need to propagate any shrubs, now is the time to take softwood cuttings of plants such as lavender, rosemary, hydrangea and philadelphus.

June-flowering shrubs such as philadelphus can be pruned now and while you are at it, take some semi-ripe cuttings to create new plants. Hydrangea and Choisya can also be propagated from cuttings that are placed in pots of gritty compost and placed into a cold frame. Remove suckers from rose bushes and trees and tie in climbers and ramblers as they grow.

House plants can benefit by being placed outside for the warmer months and plants in the greenhouse will need shading to protect them from scorching under glass. Keep an eye out for red spider mite, white fly, mealy bugs and scale insects and treat appropriately.

Finally keep on top of fallen leaves and flowers to help prevent some pest and disease problems. Above all, be sure to take some time off from weeding and watering to relax and enjoy the rewards of your labour.

JULY NATURE NOTES

Spring duly arrived in late May and proved the key for Cuckoo reports as they began to be heard in numbers. Though quite clearly the same bird, many residents in Cavalier Road heard one calling from the canal area on 26th May, the first time here for several years. Alongside our most iconic summer visitor, numbers of Swallows appeared, drawn up from the continent on the sudden southerly airflow followed a week or so later by the first Swifts.

We were personally delighted that my daughter and her family, who recently moved to a property in Up Nately that has a stable block, were 'selected' by a pair of Swallows that patiently waited for the weather to improve before building a nest.

Christine Stuart in Lychpit was the first to call me to say that half a dozen Swifts were racing and screaming above the rooftops in Lambs Row, gradually moving over the Mill Field and into the sky over Paddockfields, where, as I've mentioned previously, the good residents have erected nesting boxes to accommodate Swifts and House Martins.

Talking of nest boxes, I complained last month about one of ours being taken over by bees but another, a miniature 'G-R' post box has been selected by a pair of Great Tits, much to our delight. The box has been up for about five years with not a sniff so it was heartening to see these guys arrive. At the time of writing (9th June), the eggs have just hatched so ins and outs are VERY frequent!

I suggested last time that as spring warms up the garden, one might come across a Slowworm or two. Well, we all had to be patient but eventually it did and Ann Price sent me the photo here of a very fit looking specimen making its way across her patio, clearly appreciating the underfloor heating below it.

Terry MacInish, a keep snapper, sent me an amusing shot of a Pheasant-Squirrel face off, or perhaps they knew one another and were having a chat? Anyway, it was well caught Terry.

Many thanks to everyone who sent me pictures of the now infamous Peacock and Hen that roamed the streets and gardens and even rooftops of Old Basing for almost two weeks. The photo here is from Mike Simpson in Linden Avenue. The birds had found their way originally to the Belle Vue estate from Blacklands Farm, their adopted home, and caused many a double take from residents and motorists alike. The hen laid a couple of unfertilised eggs by the front porch of Paul and Jill Eckersley in Cavalier Road but eventually with her boyfriend deciding to go home, 'Prunella' was gently captured and taken unceremoniously back there too about five days later. Peacocks can be difficult to handle and care not where



they go so were causing consternation to 'step-parents' Ashleigh and Brad so the birds are now off to a farm near Aldermaston where they can be monitored more closely.

Everyone agreed though that it was great to have them about for all that.


