Councillors and staff would like to thank Alan for his leadership throughout his three years as Chairman, during which some long-standing issues have been progressed and brought to a conclusion.

Alan will remain as a member of the Parish Council and will continue, alongside Peter and Murray, as an active member of the Planning Response Sub-Committee which is committed to fighting the threat of further development around the Parish.

NEW BOROUGH COUNCILLOR

Congratulations to Old Basing Parish Councillor, **Kate Tuck**, on her successful election as a **Borough Councillor** representing Basing and Upton Grey Ward at the local elections in May. Kate is a keen environmentalist and will continue to oppose the threat of further development in and around the local area.

NEW DEFIBRILATOR

The **Old Basing Tennis Club** must also be congratulated on raising sufficient funds for the purchase and installation of a **defibrillator** (or **AED**) outside its clubhouse in Riley Lane, Old Basing. The Club held an enjoyable "unveiling" ceremony attended by the then Mayor, Cllr Onnalee Cubitt, followed by a barbeque *(read more on page 32)*.

This new AED follows the installation of a similar device purchased by the Village Café and installed at St Mary's Church. These, together with the two already located outside the Lychpit Community Hall and the Parish Office at the Recreation Ground means that these potential life-saving machines are just a short distance away for most residents and visitors; although, of course, we all hope they are not needed!

LOCAL WILDLIFE

Calling all wildlife enthusiasts. We are trying to find out about the biodiversity in the valley in a more consistent manner. We have contacted various organisations to see if they have records of eg butterflies, moths, bats, other insects. Do you know anyone with a bat detector or a moth lamp? We have a good list of birds including several red listed in the UK.

The Loddon Valley cuckoo has made it back from Africa and is calling along the valley again and at least one skylark is singing. With the better weather take a walk and maybe take binoculars and or lenses to look at the large and small wildlife.



You can log your finds on our site (see below). We are looking into doing hedge surveys and making a guide to family activities that can be done along a chalk stream. Walking with a river expert last month we were astonished when he identified a place where a large sea trout had laid their eggs in a redd (nest)! So they came all the way up the Thames and up the Loddon from Reading to our patch!

NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

As part of the 2022 Platinum Jubilee celebrations the Sealed Knot will hold an English Civil War Re-enactment on The Common, the site of the Siege of Basing House between the years 1642 and 1645. The house, whose owners were supporters of King Charles I, was subject to three sieges by Parliament forces, eventually being overrun by Oliver Cromwell resulting in significant damage to the house and its eventual destruction. The remaining house and grounds are today cared for by Hampshire Cultural Trust (HCT), who will be joining the Sealed Knot in delivering this event. The event will take place on Friday 3rd and Saturday 4th June. These events will be free to pedestrians, with a request for donations for parking on The Common via temporary gates on Park Lane.

The event starts on **Friday** at **noon** and will end at **4.30pm** the **following day**. Access to the Basing House ruins (south of The Street) will be free of charge on these days. However, the Barn area (on the north side of The Street) will be closed, as will the normal Basing House car park by Bartons Mill. Garrison Gate (the main entrance from The Street) will also be closed, with entrance to the Basing House site only available from Basingstoke Common. As we expect many visitors, some from afar, this should reduce potential traffic difficulties in the village. Normal arrangements will apply on Thursday and Sunday (11am to 4pm).

Old Basing joins the ranks of the villages with books set in them with the publication of **Jesse Childs's** book, **The Siege of Loyalty House.** She will be at the event signing copies.

Looking ahead to July we will have the Tudor Weekend on 9th/10th July and the Basingstoke Rock Choir performing in the Walled Garden on 14th July.

LINGUATATSTIC LANGUAGE SCHOOL



Welcome the month of June! It is thought by many that this month was named after the Roman goddess Juno, patroness of marriage and well-being of women. There is though, also the theory that the name came from the Latin juvenis, 'young people',

who were celebrated at this time. For the purposes of this article, we are going to go with the latter and celebrate young people. Afterall, whilst we do teach adults, children are the ones we first started educating 30 plus years ago and they are of course, our future. Indeed, Linguatastic has now got to that stage where the children of children who used to come to us are now attending.

Over the years, kids have come out with some hilarious comments related to our activities with them. Most of them have to be heard in the context to be fully appreciated, but there's one phrase which does get reported back to us every now and again. It is when a parent 'tries' to say something in the other language and the child comments "No, Mummy, you have to say it like this". The children are usually right! That's the beauty of learning a language from a young age, you are not yet so 'stuck' in the sounds of your native language. You can hear and can reproduce the subtle sounds of a different language. Adults tend to link their native language to the one they are learning and then end up speaking with an accent and incorrect grammar. Another advantage children have over adults is that they are often more confident. They're not yet as embarrassed about trying to say a new word and love repeating words. Tied in with this is that lots of the learning can be done through singing and dancing. Think of the alphabet, we teach the children this through song and it sticks in their head, imagine though singing the alphabet in a small group as an adult (cringe)!

Let's therefore celebrate the little ones in the world!

WHAT'S AROUND THIS MONTH?



May brought us a fleeting visit from a Nightingale and a Grasshopper Warbler. We also have Mistle Thrushes breeding around the edge of the reserve who are easy to spot especially around the play area. An exciting spot by a local was a Barred Grass Snake (see photo below), which is the first confirmation of this species here since it became its own official species separate from a normal grass snake in 2017.

During June we should see flowerings of the orchids (Common Spot and Pyramid, both a purple colour) and the Grass (pink) and Meadow (yellow) Vetchling. On warmer days butterflies to watch out for are Meadow Brown, along with the Marbled White. There'll be increased numbers of birds around the field feeding their young, the nesting Whitethroats being particularly noticeable, and we should also be seeing Swifts and House Martins in flight and the raptors such as the Hobby hunting from above. Dragonflies will also start to appear in the areas of the field near the water and the woods. Early in the morning, or later in the evening, there's also the possibility of seeing a grazing roe deer or a fox.

For those of you visiting the field, the latest sightings of all the flora and fauna (and there is a lot!) is listed on the Mill Field display board near the Little Basing entrance. Fabulous photos can also be seen on our Facebook page. As you can see from both we are so lucky to have such a rich nature reserve so it is important for all of us to stay on the paths to protect the wildlife.

JUNE IN YOUR GARDEN

There are plenty of jobs to do out there this month. Top of the list is weeds. They seem to reappear as soon as your back is turned; so regular hoeing is essential to make sure they don't take control. Perennial weeds, or those with long tap roots such as dandelions, thistles, bindweed and nettles, need to be dug out with a garden fork, otherwise they will just re-appear. Be sure to dig out every single bit of bindweed lest it re-shoot.

Lawns can be mown once a week now and edged with a half-moon edging iron to ensure that the borders are kept neat. If you have a compost heap, you can add the clippings to your pile, but be sure to do so only in thin layers to keep it properly aerated. It is a good idea to alternate green compost with 'brown' layers such as clean shredded paper or cardboard to keep the air circulating. If moss is a problem in your lawn, then you can use a combined moss killer and fertiliser to treat it, but you may want to live with a little moss, as it will keep the lawn looking green if drought hits.

Summer bedding plants and home-raised seedlings should now have been hardened off and are ready to plant into your borders and pots. Be sure to water them in well and continue to keep them hydrated in warm weather. Annuals are perfect for filling in gaps in borders and if you are quick, there is still enough time to sow late flowering plants such as Calendula and Godetia. For those who are thinking ahead, winter bedding plants such as pansies can be sown now, as can next year's wallflowers. Tidy up spring flowering perennials by cutting back foliage, which should encourage a new flush. Lift and divide hostas, primula and overcrowded bulbs. Stake tall flowers to prevent wind damage and keep tying in sweet peas and other climbing flowers.

Evergreen hedges such as Lonicera nitada, Box and Privet can be clipped this month and the slipping added to the compost heap if they aren't too woody. Once Clematis Montana has finished flowering, it can be cut back – hard if necessary, you'll be thankful for it next year as it develop into something of a monster, it can block out light and impede entrance if grown around a window or doorway. Honeysuckle and climbing roses will need tying in to their supports, the latter need to be tied as horizontal as possible to ensure the best showing of flowers. If you need to propagate any shrubs, now is the time to take softwood cuttings of plants such as lavender, rosemary, hydrangea and philadelphus.

If you are growing your own, you can keep sowing salad crops, French and Runner beans, squash, sweetcorn and outdoor cucumbers, all directly into prepared ground outside. Keep an eye out for blight on potatoes and tomatoes. Plant out vegetables such as winter brassica and sweet peppers; quick crops like radish can be sown in gaps between crops. You should be thinning your apple, pear and plum trees this month to ensure the best crop. Summer prune red and white currants and gooseberries.

All types of pests can be problematic at this time of year whether in the vegetable or flower borders. Keep and eye out for slugs eating young seedlings, caterpillars, carrot fly and aphids. Small amounts can be dealt with by hand but consider investing in mail order ladybirds (yes it is a thing – ladybirds are put in tubes, delivered first class and feed on popcorn) or nematodes (microscopic creatures, that act as parasites on other insects) to treat more severe infestations.

NATURE NOTES FOR JUNE

We are a fickle bunch aren't we? One week we are praying for nice weather so we can then its, 'crumbs we could do with some rain!' But it is true. As I write on 9th May we've seen no appreciable rain for four to five weeks and already my water butts (I have six), are all dry. The warm sunshine and southerly drift of a fortnight ago allowed many bird migrants to cross the water to these shores so it was a relief to get messaged Swallows appearing in Up Nately and Newnham Lane, birds returning to their nesting sites of last summer.

What certainly didn't go unnoticed, and to everyone's delight, was that of a Cuckoo calling in the vicinity of Hodds Farm on 5th May, the sound of which carried right along the length of Cavalier Road. It's been a few years since one has been here to my knowledge and thanks to my neighbour Pat Brace for alerting me to its presence quite early on that morning. Tony Stoney reported hearing a bird too near Silchester and Laura Haystaff said one was very loud and close to her home at Up Nately. And Swifts just turned up across Lychpit, spotted by Christine Stuart in Lambs Row, who reckoned about eight were zooming around her bit of sky on 11th May.

Fingers crossed this good weather continues for the nesting Blue Tits as their search for insects, aphids and caterpillars increases as hungry mouths appear from hatching eggs. Two of our five nestboxes sound as if they have young in them and Terry McAnish's camera box in Cavalier Close revealed eigth chicks at the weekend.

Stephen Thair has already spied a young Greenfinch in his Park Lane garden so the parents of that one must have 'started' very early. And then to confuse things further, after an uninteresting winter for spotting unusual visitors, a male Siskin turned up in early May to snack on Stephens' sunflower feeder.



Regular photograph contributor **Anthony Hutton** came up trumps again with half a dozen super shots and I found it hard to select just two to include. The first is of an arriving **Swallow** (see left), sweeping

across the tops of the rapeseed flowers at a Mapledurwell field. There must have been a bounty of insects for the bird to start putting on weight after its marathon flight, as Anthony mentioned how tricky it was to get this

snap. The second is of what could be best described as 'the tiny bird with the big voice', ie, a **Wren** (see right). Framed perfectly by Anthony in mid-tune its just a shame this column doesn't have the technology to provide sound as well as visual feasts.



Finally, it's unusual to see an Owl during the day so to see two different birds in one walk is weird but that's what happened to Alan Williams on a stroll near Silchester. Firstly, a Tawny cruised by, settling in a tree not then 15 minutes later there was a Barn Owl sitting on a post looking back toward the walkers. Insomniacs or perhaps bad hunting the previous night!
