

OLD BASING & LYCHPIT VILLAGE SHOW

THE VILLAGE CAFÉ

The Village café, your local volunteer-run community café for the community of Old Basing and Lychpit, is open on **Fridays**, **2 to 4.30pm**, **in the Parish Room**, **St Mary's Church**.

We are in March already, spring has definitely sprung and here at the café, we have been busy planning a number of events for our lovely customers. On **Friday, 6th March**, we will host another visit from **Alison's Wonderland** so come along and have a browse at the gifts and accessories on sale whilst treating yourself to a nice cuppa and a slice of cake.

We are planning to hold an **afternoon tea** event on **Friday, 22nd May, from 2 to 4pm** (slightly reduced hours than our normal opening). Anyone interested will be able to prepay and book this event and we will offer a choice of sandwich fillings to suit all. This will be offered at a set price of **£6 per person** for a **standard afternoon tea** and **£7 per person** for a **premium version**.

After our success last year supporting the **Macmillan Biggest Coffee Morning** event, we are planning to do the same this year on **Friday**, **9th October**, and combine with the café's birthday. We will have been opening our doors for two years this year and plan another celebration afternoon to thank you all for supporting us, whilst raising money for such a worthy cause. As you are aware, we supported the local charity, **Julian House** during the winter months and I am pleased to say we raised over **£1,600** to help those less fortunate than ourselves. Thank you to all our customers for helping to make a difference.

We are now raising funds to purchase an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) which will be installed outside the Parish Room, and are hopeful we will have enough money to do so later this year. We would like to say thank you to all at St Mary's Church for supporting this, with a special mention to Ian Kershaw who has worked closely with a member of our team to ensure this project is successful. In addition to providing an AED within the church grounds, we will extend our fund raising with the aim of being able to install a further device elsewhere in the village to provide life saving care if ever needed and will keep you informed of our progress.

The Village Café are now selling gift vouchers, for one, two or four people, ranging in price from £2.50 to £10. The vouchers entitle the bearer to a tea or coffee and cake of their choice, and make a thoughtful gift for friends and family. Vouchers can be purchased at the café from any of our volunteers so please ask if you are interested.

The café will be **closed** on **Fridays 10th** and **17th April** but will reopen after Easter on **Friday, 24th April**. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

SOLAR FARM - CORRECTION TO OUR FEBRUARY ARTICLE

On closer inspection the outline of the plans from the Solar Power company do include sizes and numbers of Portacabin-like structures although they are larger than the normal lorry transported temporary buildings of this nature. Also, despite further enquiry, the firm is unwilling or unable to detail their locations. They also will not comment on the connection point to the National Grid or how this will be achieved.

THEFTS FROM SHEDS AND OUTBUILDINGS

During the latter part of January there were a number of thefts from sheds in The Street and Milkingpen Lane, and possibly elsewhere. Please ensure all sheds and outbuildings are locked and do not leave valuable tools and other equipment, particularly ladders, outside.

Unfortunately, in the early hours of 23rd January the Parish Council's workshop was broken in to. Although some damage was done the enhanced security measures installed following the previous break in, including a very effective smoke cloak system, meant that only one item was stolen. Hopefully this will deter any future attempts.

COUNCILLOR VACANCIES

We are sorry to lose two of our Old Basing Councillors, **Chris Fowler** and **Kerry-Ann Chamberlain**, both of whom resigned in January. Councillors make an important contribution to the community and the minimum requirement is to attend the monthly full Parish Council meetings; however, you would be encouraged to join one or more committees and possibly become involved in other Parish issues. Additional information is available from the Parish Office.

MISSING POST BOX

Following the disappearance of the post box in Hatch Lane we contacted Royal Mail to find out when the box would be replaced. Apparently, despite a "Royal Mail" notice being placed on the box stating it had been removed due to road closure, Royal Mail informed us the box had been stolen and would not be replaced stating "As part of our regulatory requirements, we must ensure that there's a post box within half a mile of at least 98% of all 'delivery points' (usually a customer's letterbox) nationally. After checking our records I can confirm that there is another box a few hundred yards away at the entrance to Byfleet Avenue and another even closer at the entrance to Fairthorne Rise, just after the turning into Bellevue Road from Hatch Lane". We have expressed dissatisfaction at this response and this has been escalated, however it is most likely that Royal Mail will not be replacing this post box.





NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

With our **2020 opening** now scheduled for **Easter Monday (13th April)**, plans for the new season are being finalised. And this year, the opening week, which falls in the school holidays, will be just a little bit different.

For the **opening day** the **Sealed Knot** return for the first of the **Civil War events** planned for the year – which commemorate the **375th anniversary of the fall of the House**.

This will be a **living history event demonstrating life in the Civil War era** – not just the battles but how real people lived at the time. In addition to the Civil War displays (and cannon bangs), the springtime flowers will be out.

The first week then continues with a **week-long celebration of springtime** against a background of the springtime flowers that bedeck the 14-acre site.

From the **Tuesday to the Friday** there will be **special activities for children** making the perfect spring day for all the family.

At the weekend **Hens for Live** visit, bringing their adorable chicks for cuddling and handling in the Tudor Great Barn, while they also talk about the best ways to love and care for hens of all ages. Outside, springtime activities continue with experts from charities like the **Wildlife Trust**, **Woodland Trust** and **Butterfly Conservation Trust** exhibiting across the site.

All these April events will feature our new **Bothy Tea Room**, set close to the ruins where tea and cake can be enjoyed in a beautiful setting surrounded by stories of the past.

Outdoor theatre – with the Chapterhouse Theatre Company – will return to the Walled Garden at Basing House in 2020 with *Little Women* (Sunday, 28th June) and *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* (Summer Bank Holiday Monday, 31st August).

HOLY GROUND

In spring 2016 I had the great privilege of visiting the Holy Land. I remember the sense of expectation as I set off that I was going to walk on holy ground. Holy, for it was the ground on which Jesus came to earth, on which he walked, prayed, ate, taught, challenged, healed, met friends...

For me, there were wonderful transforming moments where I encountered God in a new way. But of course, the Holy Land is not the only Holy Ground. There are many pilgrimage sites where people have encountered God, and been transformed by God. Pilgrimage sites closer to home include Iona or Lindisfarne. And we, along with generations before us, encounter God in our churches – Holy Ground at St Mary's Church and at Old Basing Methodist Church. Places where God is present in sacrament and symbol. Here too is a place where people meet with God, and are transformed by God. We're fortunate that our church is open during daylight hours throughout the year, and anyone is welcome to come in.

Yet, the whole of the earth is hallowed – this earth that was created and is loved by God, this earth on which God came to dwell in Jesus. There is no place on earth where we cannot encounter God. As the Psalmist says in Psalm 139: 'if I go down to the depths or up to the heights, you are there O God'. There is no place on this earth that is beyond God. We have the potential to be transformed by an encounter with God both inside and outside the church.

Maybe you encounter God in creation. Seeing the vivid colours of the sunrise over the common might reveal to you something of the beauty of our creator God. Perhaps you have encountered God in the people you have met: the generosity or kindness of a friend, a conversation that sparked hope, a loving gesture from a stranger.

Perhaps you have encountered God even in difficult places. We saw a powerful example of this in Palestine, where we met with Christians who had turned broken glass found in the debris of war into angels of hope, reminding us that God came into our broken world, transforming what appears worthless and hopeless into a beautiful and whole creation.

God is everywhere, so in a very important sense every place is holy. Yet we will probably find that certain times and places leave us with a feeling of being closer to God than others. It's important to take notice of them. So, I wonder what places have been Holy Ground for you, and significant in your life journey?

We will be continuing to clear areas for the benefit of the field's wildlife such as the Field Mouse, Yellow Necked Mouse, Bank Voles and Shrews and the raptors who prey on them.

To join us you don't need to book in advance just come along on the day, the more the merrier and regular users of the field are particularly welcome. No special skills are required just appropriate clothes and footwear and we will provide tea, coffee and tools. You will find us on the **lower path** from **10am**, the location will be marked on the notice board near the entrance opposite Little Basing.

WHAT'S AROUND THIS MONTH

In March we hope to see our first migrants of 2020 like the Green Finch and the last of the winter visitors such as the Redwing and Fieldfare with maybe Waxwings feeding on the remaining rose hips. If we get any spring-like weather Butterflies should start appearing such as the Red Admiral, Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell or Brimstone. In January bird sightings included Kestrels, Linnets, Goldfinch, Waxwings, Peregrine and Little Egrets and if you are up early enough you could hear the Tawny Owls before dawn and in the afternoon Muntjac barking in the woods.

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

It's been a very quiet period so quite a short edition of Nature Notes this month.

An intrepid band of seven souls braved the drizzle, chill and mud on 26th January for a couple of hours to make a start on the huge job of cleaning up the stream by the railway line and behind Bexmoor Way (see photos before and after, right and below). Years of neglect meant that it was full of mud, sticks and overhanging branches, not to mention the ten sacks of rubbish discarded by thoughtless people. The following week a couple of the guys revisited the footpath along Piggy Dam and collected ANOTHER six bags of discards, and this, only a year after their last litter pick!

We have only made a dent but it's a start and as I alluded to last month it would be wonderful if we can make a real impact before spring arrives when we will need to stop so as not to disturb nature too much. If you fancy helping, please give me a call.



As I write (4th February) the winter so far has remained mild so unless there's been a big change between now and when you read this hopefully we will have seen the season off. Of course, 'Beasts from the East' hit us in March previously and even stayed until early April as I recall one year but fingers crossed for us gardeners and spring lovers that won't be the case this year. So many plants were damaged, early bird eggs and young lost as well as frog spawn damaged that a repeat



would be hard to take. Right now there are many flowers showing and buds appearing plus I'm hearing skylarks starting to sing to attract a mate and watching robins scrapping for their territories!

I hope some of you joined along with the 'Big Garden Birdwatch' back in late January and had a successful watch. It was a little disappointing here in our garden with just the usual suspects putting in an appearance but it was fairly damp and miserable whereas some frosty weather might have encouraged more little brown job (name used by birdwatchers for any of the large number of species of small brown passerine birds), to have ventured to the feeders. Blackbirds, robins, dunnocks, pigeons and house sparrows made up our collection and I noted on-line a week after the results started to come in that over six million sparrows had been counted so clearly they are recovering from the slump a decade ago.

We have just invested in two new sparrow colony boxes (three 'houses' per box) so hopefully us doing our bit will continue to assist this particular bird's revival. Although it's now March as you read this you still just about have time to put up any box and if you need any advice of what to buy and where to locate then please don't hesitate to contact me.

MARCH IN YOUR GARDEN

What a wonderful time of year for the gardener. The snowdrops are out, daffodils poking their heads up and crocus' making a gorgeous display all over the village.

To prepare for the growing season ahead, it is a good idea to fertilise your beds. Once your soil is workable, dig a 5-cm (2-inch), or more, layer of compost or well-rotted manure into your beds. At the same time work in a general-purpose fertiliser, such as pelleted chicken manure, or the old faithful – fish, blood and bone!

There is a lot of sowing that can be done. Some flowers can be started off in the greenhouse, but hardy annuals such as Poppies, certain varieties of Sweet Peas and Cornflowers can be sown directly into the ground. Apple and Cherry trees can also be planted, but be sure to be ready with the horticultural fleece in case of frosts! They will damage the young leaves. Silver and grey leaf shrubs are the most at risk of frosts at this time of year.

March is the time when our thoughts drift to rhubarb. To encourage long, tender stalks it is a good idea to cover the crowns with old buckets, or similar, which will exclude any light. Meanwhile you can still make late plantings of soft fruit such as gooseberry, raspberry and strawberry.

Ornamental grasses should have dead foliage cut back to allow for new growth. Summerflowering bulbs can be planted now, as can snowdrops for next year. If the weather stays nice and dry, lawns may need a mow, not too short, just removing the leaf tips. Where moss is a problem on lawns moss killers can be applied.

Roses will do well being fed with a balanced fertiliser or special rose feed. Now is an ideal time for roses to be pruned – stems should be cut back to an outward facing bud by about a half on bush varieties.

Greenhouses can suffer from condensation in springtime, open any vents on warmer days. Whilst you are out, and preferably before the month gets going, search round your pots, bricks and all those nooks and crannies for hibernating snails and slugs and dispose of them before they run amok.

Onion sets can be planted this month but sow under some netting to prevent inquisitive birds from undoing all your hard work. If you planted broad beans back in November and they haven't shown themselves yet, not to worry, more can be sown now, however they will do battle with black fly, more so than the November-sown crop.

Finally, unlike past years let's hope that this growing season will have some normality to it for once!






