PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

WATER BOTTLE REFILL STATION

As part of the Parish Council's drive to reduce the use of plastic we have installed a water bottle refill station outside of the Pavilion Tea Room at the recreation ground in Old Basing. Most of us now have refillable drinking water bottles and this will provide fresh drinking water for anyone using the recreation grounds. Our thanks go to our County Councillor, Elaine Still and Borough Councillor, Onnalee Cubitt for recognising the benefit of this facility to the community and providing grant funding to cover the costs involved.

MILKINGPEN LANE

Cllr Elaine Still has been successful in persuading Hampshire Highways to include remedial works to the road surface of Milkingpen Lane on its Operation Resilience programme, with (hopefully) work due to start in the spring.

FIGHT AGAINST THE DESTRUCTION OF OUR COUNTRYSIDE

The fight continues. You can read a summary of what the Parish Council has done and continues to do in its fight against development of three sites around our parish in the Old **Basing & Lychpit Community Newsletter** which is due to drop through your letterbox during the first week in March. We continue to work with SOLVE to get the message across that Old Basing and Lychpit has had more than its fair share of development over the years and any further development will have a detrimental effect on the River Loddon valley and put a serious strain on the already overloaded local infrastructure.

CLIMATE ACTION

Following a virtual meeting with **Community Energy South**, as mentioned in last month's Basinga, we have a face-to-face meeting of **Loddon Community Energy** (generating community owned energy locally) scheduled after the copy date of this edition of the Basinga – details to follow. In the interim, we have been contacted regarding initiating a community electric car-sharing club. No details as yet, but we will be asking for interest should this prove worth while pursuing.

MEET YOUR COUNCILLORS

Over the coming months we will be holding 'Meet Your Councillor' sessions in various locations within the parish. These will run from 10am to noon and three or four Councillors will be there to answer queries, note any issues raised and generally be available to anyone wishing to drop by for a chat over a cup of tea or coffee. You may be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor yourself, and this might be an ideal opportunity to discuss what is involved without any prior commitment. The first session will be at the Lychpit Community Hall on Thursday, 24th February,



followed by a second in Old Basing in the **Pavilion Tea Room** on **Thursday, 28th April**. Dates and locations of future events will be published as soon as these are determined.

NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

Basing House is currently closed for the winter and will reopen in April - more news on that, and the programme for 2022 in the next Basinga.

One of the newest things in Basing House – and a thing that most visitors remember – is celebrating its tenth birthday during March, is the Basing House Lego model (see front cover photo). The model was built in March 2012 at Milestones Museum, by Brighter Bricks, a professional Lego building company. It was the centrepiece of the first of the Lego exhibitions at Milestones that went on to run for a number of years. There were four models, the Old House, the New House, the Walled Garden and the Barn, although in reality the old and new houses were made as many separate buildings, which allowed them to be transported, firstly to the Bothy at Basing House where it spent the 2012 season before being moved to the Great Hall in Winchester for the winter. The following spring it wandered back to Basing House and since then has graced the entrance kiosk. allowing visitors to see a representation of what Basing House was like before exploring the ruins. The model of the Barn ended up in the Visitor Centre and the Walled Garden in the museum, overlooking the formal part of the garden. The model was based on an artistic reconstruction of the site painted by Mike Codd and based on illustrations of the site from the time it was there, and on the archaeological remains which give a detailed floor plan.

Lego models of historic buildings have become much more common over the last ten years, but the Basing House model still has that "Wow" factor for visitors and provides a brilliant background for explaining the site.

ENCOURAGING SCORE FOR COUNCIL'S CLIMATE CHANGE PLAN

Figures published by Climate Emergency UK have shown that the climate change action plan for Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is ranked above the national average and scored second highest in the county.

Setting out a series of actions for addressing the climate emergency, the council's plan was assessed along with the plans from a total of 409 local authorities in the country and scored 54%, with the average for UK councils being 46%. In Hampshire, only Fareham Borough Council's plan scored more with 61%.

All UK councils' climate change action plans that were published online before 20th September 2021, and written after 2015, were assessed by a team of over 120 volunteers, trained and overseen by Climate Emergency UK, a not-for-profit co-operative. Each council was given a scorecard, with scores being based on councils' plans for actions to address the climate emergency, rather than reflecting steps already taken.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council declared a climate emergency in September 2019 and adopted its Climate Change and Air Quality Strategy in March 2021. Cabinet Member for the Natural Environment and Climate Improvement Cllr Mark Ruffell said: "We are grateful to Climate Emergency UK for its hard work and pleased that our plan has scored well, with the assessment reflecting the balance of realistic and achievable actions in our ambitious plan while highlighting best practice examples for us to learn from and base future actions on.

"This plan is a good starting point but we are well aware that it is vital to back this up with action and the assessment does not capture all of the impressive work the council has done already to implement its strategy.

"This includes our recent launch of an interactive climate change toolkit to help local communities understand what they can do to make a difference, and the council itself is already taking steps to reduce its own carbon footprint, including making our buildings more energy efficient.

"We have also started work on reducing carbon emissions in the borough in the long term. Innovative new policies for sustainable development are being drafted as part of our work to update the Local Plan, and we are also considering other schemes, which could include installing additional public electric vehicle charging points to further support and encourage environmentally friendly travel choices, following the installation of chargers in Overton and Whitchurch and the creation of Hampshire's first electric vehicle charging hub at Feathers Yard in Basingstoke.

"We'll be presenting our latest progress on delivering against our strategy and action plan to the Community, Environment and Partnerships Committee in March."

SORT YOUR LIFE OUT!

At the end of last year I found myself getting mildly addicted to Stacey Solomon's 'Sort Your Life Out' on BBC telecvision. If you've not seen it, Stacey visits a family who are overwhelmed by stuff and lacking adequate storage. The family pack up all their belongings which are then laid out in a giant warehouse for them to decide what to keep, and what to donate, sell or recycle. Stacey usually encourages families to get rid of around 50% of their stuff, whilst her fabulous team of cleaners and builders clean the home and install storage solutions – essentially shelves and cupboards!

As someone who is prone to accumulating clutter and being rather sentimental about stuff, I found it a hugely inspiring programme. Once all the families' belongings are returned to the house and neatly ordered there is an immense sense of calm; having been stripped back, the house is now a place to enjoy together. And it inspired me in a very practical way: at the start of each programme Stacey says that most households have thousands of items they never use. So we set ourselves a challenge – to get rid of 500 items in January. In the end, we only managed to give away 250 items, but that was more to do with time constraints and I'm confident there is plenty more clearing we can still do!

Stacey and her team usually find that the items families have kept are heavy with meaning and memory, and the time to take stock of 'stuff' often also means a time to think back on the stories of life that have been – and also the things that people hope for in the future. Lent is traditionally a time for Christians to think about clearing out the many different types of clutter that fill up our lives. We do so with the intention of making space to reflect on all that has been, to lament, to hope, as we look towards the great feast of Easter. It is a taking stock of where we are in our relationships with one another, with ourselves, with the world, and above all with God. Traditionally this was linked to fasting, with pancake day (Shrove Tuesday) being the day to use up the eggs and fats in the house before the Lenten fast began. Today Christians may mark Lent in a variety of ways, each intending to make space for God – whether that be through clearing physical stuff or making space for greater time for prayer, Bible Study, and reflection. Christian or not, though, we all need space to recall what has been, and to look forward to what is to come – I hope that is something that you may find this Lent and throughout the year.

If you're inspired to make space this Lent, Lent begins on 2nd March this year.

EVENT NEWS

Winter is nearly at an end and so we are having our last **scrub bashing** session of the season which is on **Saturday**, **19th March**, before the site starts growing again. We will be continuing to clear the area of scrub between the play area and Bartons Lane, all for the benefit of the field's wildlife such as small mammals and the plants which are being overwhelmed.

In the event that nearer the time there are new Covid restrictions, can you let me know if you are coming using the email below so I know numbers and I can advise how we will be managing the work party safely. No special skills are required just appropriate clothes and footwear and we will provide tea, coffee and tools. Meet at the **play area** at **10am** or find us. Any last-minute changes will be posted on Facebook and the field notice board, and if you can email that you are coming then I can provide updates.

WHAT'S AROUND THIS MONTH

March welcomes the beginning of spring as we hear resident birds such as Song Thrush, Robin and Wren in full song. While we say farewell to the Redwings, Fieldfare, Siskins and Lesser Redpolls who are heading back north, the first of the summer migrants begin to arrive starting with Chiffchaff and Blackcap (the very first ones you hear braved the winter).

The plant life suddenly starts to burst to life with Lesser Celandine and Arum Lillies (Lords and ladies) coming through with many trees starting to flower. Mammal wise, Roe and Muntjac will be heard barking in the woods and when warm enough bats start to emerge. If we get any spring-like weather butterflies should start appearing such as the Red Admiral, Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell or Brimstone and maybe the occasional reptile too!

CALLING ALL NATURALISTS

Calling all naturalists (read carefully or this could turn into a very different project)! LINGUATASTIC LANGUAGE SCHOOL



It's World Book Day on 3rd of this month and Linguatastic will be celebrating the event in various ways in its classes. We thought though, that we could also celebrate the day through this article and share some interesting languageand book-related facts with you.

MARCH IN YOUR GARDEN

What a wonderful time of year for the gardener March is. The snowdrops are out, daffodils poking their heads up and crocus' making a gorgeous display all over the village. But as a quote from Charles Dickens' *Great Expectations*:

"It was one of those March days when the sun shines hot and the wind blows cold: when it is summer in the light, and winter in the shade"

shows. March can be a fickle month weather wise.

To prepare for the growing season ahead, it is a good idea to fertilise your beds. Once your soil is workable, dig a 5-cm (2-inch), or more, layer of compost or well-rotted manure into your beds. At the same time, work in a general-purpose fertiliser, such as pelleted-chicken manure, or the old faithful – fish, blood and bone!

There is a lot of sowing that can be done. Some flowers can be started off in the greenhouse, but hardy annuals such as Poppies, certain varieties of Sweet Peas and Cornflowers can be sown directly into the ground. Apple and Cherry trees can also be planted, but be sure to be ready with the horticultural fleece in case of frosts! They will damage the young leaves. Silver and grey-leaf shrubs are the most at risk of frosts at this time of year.

March is the time when our thoughts drift to rhubarb. To encourage long, tender, stalks it is a good idea to cover the crowns with old buckets, or similar, which will exclude any light. Meanwhile you can still make late plantings of soft fruit such as gooseberry, raspberry and strawberry.

Ornamental grasses should have dead foliage cut back to allow for new growth. Summerflowering bulbs can be planted now, as can snowdrops for next year. If the weather stays nice and dry, lawns may need a mow, not too short, just removing the leaf tips. Where moss is a problem on lawns moss killers can be applied.

Roses will do well being fed with a balanced fertiliser or special rose feed. Now is an ideal time for roses to be pruned – stems should be cut back to an outward facing bud by about a half on bush varieties.

Greenhouses can suffer from condensation in springtime, open any vents on warmer days. Whilst you are out, and preferably before the month gets going, search round your pots, bricks and all those nooks and crannies for hibernating snails and slugs and dispose of them before they run amok.

Onion sets can be planted this month but sow under some netting to prevent inquisitive birds from undoing all your hard work. If you planted broad beans back in November and they haven't shown themselves yet, not to worry, more can be sown now, however they will do battle with black fly, more so than the November-sown crop.

You might also consider growing your own herbs – it is really easy. Many are annuals, simply grown from seed each year. If your soil is heavy and water-retaining, lightly fork in some horticultural grit over the whole area, this will improve drainage. Some herbs are perennials and these will benefit from some garden compost or rotted manure.

Finally, unlike past years let's hope that this growing season will have some regularity to it for once!

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

I did forget to mention in my New Year notes that The Big Gardenwatch was approaching at the end of January but I've no doubt the media publicity around this annual event did ring your bell and that you managed a successful hour during the weekend of 29th/30th January. Sadly, the author cannot report such joy of varied and numerical triumph personally, but I know some people that did. Saturday was a very windy day, often the reason why birds get easily spooked and therefore preventing them from showing well. Sunday was okay so I have no excuses to why our usual garden visitors didn't show up so I couldn't with any conscience tick the Blackcap, Song Thrush and Great Spotted Woodpecker that were all here 48 hours before! Fortunately, I did ask our Cavalier Road neighbours who share a WhatsApp group to let me know what they saw too so I could at least make a collective case for an article this month. Five took part and between us we managed 15 species so not a bad result really, but how did YOU do? Let me know.

A little brown bird (job), an LBJ in birders terms, caused a ruffle of feathers here last month too with keen spotters from all over the South coming to Old Basing for a glimpse of a **Richards Pipit**. An Asiatic species, this visitor is a rare sight in the UK and indeed a first on record for Hampshire. Credit goes to **Jim Andrews** of the Mill Field group for uncovering this unremarkably looking bird down by the Loddon near Wildmoor. Jim explained that its unusual contact call was what alerted him and his colleague and through the lens of his Nikon 1000, not only identified it but managed a couple of shots too (see photo on Basinga website). Not a magnificent sight by any stretch but for a birding fanatic, it was pure gold.



Now a bird that does light everyone's fire is the sight of a **Kingfisher** speeding across the surface of a river or pond and as well as the regular one that shows itself near Bartons Mill, so another obliging bird isn't shy to photographers at the Black Dam. Previous snapper, **Anthony Hutton**, and his lad **Robin** visited the Dam a couple of weeks ago and found the bird again in posing mood so duly took several photographs. including this one (see right), with a stickleback. Young master Hutton clearly has a great eye for the game and you wouldn't bet against him making a career out of it. Well done Robin, there will be many out there envious of your tenacity to find such a beautiful subject and to take such a great shot.

Now whilst talking photography, another 'hat I wear' is as a committee member of the **Old Basing & Lychpit Village Show** and this month you will now be able to find the schedule for this year's event in September. The Show also has a photographic competition, and the three chosen subjects this year are: 'Taking Flight' (so you might be looking at insects, birds, bats or planes!), 'Down by the River' (could be anywhere, not just the Loddon) and 'Optical Illusions' (well, this could be anything and anywhere, and truly tests the skilful eye of the taker and audience).
