

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING - MONDAY 16 MAY

Our Annual Parish Meeting this year will be held at the **Royal British Legion**, **Old Basing**, starting at **7.30pm**. Our speaker for the evening will be Simon Cooper, Founder and Managing Director of Fishingbreaks.co.uk based in Stockbridge. Simon has written a book on "The Life of a Chalk Stream" and this will be the subject of his presentation which will be of interest not only to those residents concerned about protecting the environment and in particular the River Loddon, but also to fishing enthusiasts.

RECREATION GROUNDS

With the onset of warmer weather, the recreation grounds will attract more visitors. Over recent months a considerable amount of work has been carried out at the recreation ground and Belle Vue repairing and improving play and exercise equipment and refurbishing the benches and picnic tables. Two additional waste bins were purchased last year to cope with an increase in waste – please use them and also make use of the newly installed water bottle refill station located outside the tea room to cut back on disposable plastic bottles.

COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION

At the April Parish Council meeting we were pleased to welcome a new Councillor, Charlie Butfoy, who has lived in Lychpit for many years and is keen to play his part in Parish Council activities. We do, however, now have another Councillor vacancy following the resignation of Alan Jones who, after several years of dedicated service on the Parish Council, has decided it is now time to take a step back. Alan has taken a keen interest in planning matters and was also the Parish Council's transport representative and a Community Speedwatch volunteer. We will be sorry to see Alan go and wish him well for the future.

FIVE WAYS DEVELOPMENT - MISSING TREES

Some will have noticed that there is a void next to the old Children's Home - three Horse Chestnut trees have been removed. In the comprehensive tree survey submitted by the developer, Blenheim Construction Ltd, these trees were to be retained. Instead, they have been razed to the ground. Although the trees in question lie outside the Conservation Area and are without Tree Preservation Orders, they were part of the protection plans which, we understood, would be retained as part of this development and their removal significantly affects the landscape. The site was bound by mature vegetation, which itself was a major feature in defining the character of this part of Old Basing. The Parish Council is disappointed that the developer has chosen to remove the trees and we would urge them to consider replacements.

BELLE VUE RECREATION AREA - FLY-TIPPING

During the past month there have been two instances of garden waste being fly-tipped at the Belle Vue recreation area. The Parish Council is responsible for dealing with fly-tipping on its land including disposal costs so if you see this happening, please report it to the Parish Office and we will try to identify those responsible.

NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

The Basing House site reopened on 9th April and we are now open, **Wednesday** to **Sunday**, **11.00am** to **4.00pm** until the autumn. As has been the case in recent years tickets allow repeat visits for a calendar year.

The Sealed Knot – the long established national Civil War re-enactment group is staging a major event on the common over the Platinum Jubilee weekend, the full arrangements are not yet clear. For the time of the event, Basing House will be part of the greater event, with different parking and admission arrangements to usual, including access from the common. Many of these arrangements are designed to try and minimise the effect on the village, so may seem a little drastic for those who live here and wish to attend the event.

The Basing House facilities – including the Bothy tea room will be open as part of the event with home-made soup and sandwiches as well as cakes and beverages. Crisps, ice creams and snacks too! However, the barn will not be open.

Just every now and then Basing House takes a role in the modern world, and it is doing so at the moment as the site is being used for the training of search dogs (and their trainers). Obviously the 14 acre site with its various holes and buildings provides a good environment for this and in the past we have staged other rescue services exercises using our wells and other pits and our Tudor tunnel.

LINGUATASTIC LANGUAGE SCHOOL



We don't see them as much nowadays, but there are still parts of the UK where Maypoles are erected and danced around at this time of the year. In some parts of Germany, a "Maibaum" (May tree) can be found in

the village square. They can be anything between 20 and 50 metres tall and as you can imagine, the erection can be quite an event in itself. They are decorated differently in the different regions. Often the trunk will be stripped and then decorated with ribbons, garlands or crepe paper and towards the top, there's a wreath, referred to as the "Kranz".

Aside from the large Maibaum in the centre of a village/town, some people also follow the tradition of the "Liebesmaien". These are small trees, traditionally put up by single men outside the houses of their girlfriends (or those they want to be their girlfriend) to show them their love. In some parts of the country, there's even the tradition that if a tree is put up outside the same person's house three years in a row, it is a proposal of marriage!

Be it to celebrate love or simply the coming of the summer, May is for most, certainly thought of as a lovely month. It does though, also signal the start of exams. So, we'd like to take this opportunity to wish our GCSE and A-level pupils all the very best!

DEAR FRIENDS

For many of us, the past couple of years have been exhausting. There have been different factors for each of us that have contributed to this exhaustion: needing to adapt the ways we work during the pandemic (including carrying extra responsibilities), facing the uncertainty of unemployment, living with increased isolation and anxiety, finding ourselves home-schooling children, or simply not being able to do the things that refresh us – whether that is singing in a choir, playing sport with a team, or going on a holiday. Even as things begin to return to 'normal' many people still carry the tiredness of the past couple of years.



As I become aware personally of how exhausting the past couple of years have been, I realise that I am not alone. When I turn to the Bible, I take great comfort in the words of Jesus, who says: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30).

For me there is great comfort in knowing that God is with me, and that I can take any burden to God in prayer. When I was at theological college the former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, came to visit and spoke about prayer. One of the things that he said to us that I have held on to is that prayer is a time when nothing is expected of us. It is a time when we simply come as we are to God. Prayer is an opportunity to lean on God.

We can of course pray anywhere, but I am really pleased that St Mary's church is able to remain open each day for anyone who wants to come in for a time of reflection or prayer, to share the weights they carry with God. I hope and pray that the church can be a place where we find rest with God.

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT ALL CREATURES GREAT AND SMALL

Old Basing resident, Stephen Thair, the speaker at the Probus Club of Basingstoke, and himself a member, sought to air his concerns about the way our planet is headed.

The speaker cited many reasons for changes in the world's ecology. Some UK plants flower a month earlier than decades ago before bees have emerged to pollinate them. Housing developments need to be neutral in water usage to overcome the impact on the environment. The RSPB calculates that in the last 50 years, from 1972, this country has lost over 38 million birds.

Nevertheless, there has been progress on several fronts. The International Whaling Commission set catch limits to preserve stocks. In 2020 only Japan and Norway were whaling commercially. Today whale watching has become a tourist activity.

Cod stocks off Newfoundland are at 10% of the level seen in 1960. Herrings, around Britain, are now said to be in good numbers following a ban from 1977 – 1983. Tins of Tuna

claim that the contents have been caught by lines rather than by nets.

Tequila fish were extinct in Mexico. They have been reintroduced after being bred in an aquarium at Chester Zoo. Rewilding in West Sussex has seen the return of Nightingales, Turtle Doves and breeding White Storks. Last year 72 pairs of Common Crane fledged 40 chicks with the result that today there are more than in the 17th Century.

Tropical rainforests, the lungs of the world, are subject to extensive logging. Deforestation of biodiverse forests takes place in some parts to grow palm trees for their oil.

The UN COP-15 biodiversity conference is planned for August in China. The aim is to make 30% of the Earth's land and seas to be protected areas by 2030. Of twenty goals set at a similar conference in 2010, to be achieved by 2020, none have been fully met.

The pressure is on us all to do something to bring these targets back on track. Time is running out. See www.probusbasingstoke.club

Getting Wild About Gardens

The buzz of a bee... the sweet scent of honeysuckle... the splash of a frog hopping into a pond... chattering birds in a hedge. These precious moments are not only delightful to experience in our gardens, they're vital if we're going to protect, restore and reconnect UK wildlife.

Since 2013, The Wildlife Trusts have partnered with the Royal Horticultural Society on our Wild About Gardens initiative – encouraging everyone with a garden to provide food and shelter for wildlife. In fact, you don't even need a garden to get involved: window-boxes, a bee brick in your wall, or flower-rich balconies can all make a difference.

Wild About Gardens follows a different theme each year, inspiring gardeners to help a different species. For example, in previous years we've separately championed hedgehogs, bats and butterflies.

So, why is it so important for us to dedicate our own patch to wildlife? Well, almost 90% of UK households have a garden. This equates to over 20 million gardens, which, incredibly, covers a larger area than all 2,300 Wildlife Trust nature reserves combined. With many UK species in decline, using these spaces means we can collectively make a huge difference to our struggling wildlife.

It doesn't even have to involve lots of time and money because letting nature take its own course can often be the best way. Try leaving a patch of grass to grow wild and you'll soon have lots of new visitors, plus it can work wonders for our own wellbeing.

We're dedicating this year's Wild About Gardens to our high-flying summer visitors – swifts, swallows, and house martins. While these amazing migrant birds rarely touch the ground and only remain in the



UK for a few months a year, there are still ways we can help them.

Swifts and house martins were recently added to the UK's Red List for birds, meaning they're seriously threatened, have suffered severe declines, and require urgent action. The simplest thing you can do is let a patch of grass grow long – this will encourage insects in your garden and provide food for birds. You can have a similar effect by planting a colourful, insect-friendly wildflower border. Creating a boggy garden patch will provide mud that swallows and house martins use to build their nests. And to provide a home for a swift, consider installing a swift box or brick.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust have a team of volunteer Wilder Garden Champions who can offer free personal advice on how to make your spaces wilder to benefit you and nature.



MAY IN YOUR GARDEN

The benefit of gardening to our physical well-being is obvious but during these uncertain times maybe just as important are the positive effects on our mental health, a fact recognised as long ago as 1577 by Thomas Hill who advises: 'The garden is a ground plot for the mind'. With this is mind, there is plenty to get the mind and body going this month!

Now is the perfect time to get rid of weeds. The soft, moist soil from winter rains makes pulling them out very easy. Make sure though that you pull out the entire root system. Manual weeding is the ultimate choice for your garden, since it avoids all sorts of chemicals and herbicides.

Keep on mowing your lawn. Now is also the perfect time to rejuvenate an old lawn by reseeding bare patches or apply a top dressing of fertiliser to replenish its nutrients.

With spring bulbs once they have gone over, resist the temptation to cut back their foliage, instead, let it die and break down on its own. Add liquid fertiliser around the clumps to give you an even better display next spring.

Shrubs that have finished their winter blooming can also be pruned now. There's still also time to catch up on pruning your roses, if you haven't had the occasion to yet. And, of course, there are many types of hedges that can still be pruned.

You can also plant summer hanging baskets, adding good-quality compost, slow-release fertiliser and water-retaining crystals, to keep them in top condition. Protect them from late

frost under cover.

With the warmer days, now is a good time to get children involved in the garden. More than just a way to spend time having fun, it's also a very healthy way to build up immunity and teach children how wonderful nature is. Why not start a children's vegetable patch or make a herbarium. Propagate your houseplants; this will give them a plant of their own to care for.



Now is a good time to set up a simple compost pile to stash all that nutrient-rich material! Weeds can even be recycled into liquid fertilizer with just a pail and water. Ferment them to extract nutrients you can use to water your houseplants! Kids love making bubbly potions too!

If we have warm days, remember to open greenhouse vents and doors. If we are fortunate to have any hot days you can also damp down your greenhouse to increase humidity and deter red spider mites.

Visit garden stores, nurseries, and horticulture centres. Many have online-services, if you are not able to visit in person, it is perfectly possible to buy online and have them delivered. Always remember, you can also start cuttings from your favourite plants, or divide them, a free alternative!

NATURE NOTES FOR MAY

Many of you will know the 'March' expression of 'In like a lion and out like a lamb'. Well, we had pretty much the opposite this year with lovely warm weather through a good part of March and then really cold frosty nights to welcome in April. As a gardener I'm now a little bit tired of fleecing up my greenhouse seedlings every night and lighting the heater to ensure my efforts to grow a summer display aren't in vain, but for early breeding birds such as ducks or robins, sub-zero temperatures would be a matter of potential life or death, as indeed it did to all the blossom on every Magnolia tree around our estate. Such a pity.

However, the warm days that I mentioned above gave many butterflies the opportunity to hatch and take to the wing. The earliest are nearly always the lemon-coloured Brimstone and many people spotted these around the 17th–18th March, quickly followed by Peacock and Comma sightings.

It's sometimes hard to know with certain birds that migrate as to whether they did or not choose to do so during the winter. For the past decade its been well established that warblers such as Blackcaps and Chiffchaffs aren't bothering and can switch their diets to cope with milder winters so when I heard the latter sounding off on March 19th, that would be, personally, the earliest one I've ever heard. A week or two on I couldn't go anywhere without noticing the (somewhat) monotonous 'chink-chank' call of a male bird announcing his presence and claiming that territory.

There is a little concern within the bird world that the well-known migrants such as Swallows and House Martins are a bit late this year but historical charts do show massive trend swings for their arrivals, ranging from early March in 2019 to mid-April a year later. This is normally down to favourable winds and conditions during their passageway from Africa so cold northerlies, forecast tomorrow (7th April) are not going to encourage anything to come here!

My thanks for observations and photographs sent to me this month, in particular from

Peter Wallis, Stephen Thair and Anthony Hutton. Peter's contribution was to mention the Goldcrests that leap about excitedly outside of his bedroom window, an endearing sight of a beautiful bird but concerning too for its well-being. Previously these birds, and also Pied Wagtails, seem to get freaked out by their own reflections and either challenge it or perform a courtship dance, oblivious to the fact that is them! (Well, what would you think if nobody had ever explained the concept of a mirror before??)

Anthony, and indeed his son Robin, have sent great photos to me in the past and I had difficulty deciding which ones to use this month such were the quality. In the end it had to be this super shot of a Kestrel just lifting off of its perch (*right*) and also of the Mandarin Duck (*next page*), found on



the Odiham Canal.

This, a couple of months after Anthony snapped a Wood Duck near the same spot. Logically it would seem as if somebody has lost part of their 'exotic wildfowl' collection.! **Rick Bourne.**

Entry criteria is that the boat should be home-made, unpowered and no longer than 45cm, after that it's up to your own imagination. There will be a prize for first boat across the finish line, and an additional prize for the "Best looking Boat" in the race. So come on let your imagination and creativity go wild and rope your parents and family in to wow us with your entries. We look forward to seeing what you bring.

What's around this month:

During May we'll be seeing much more wildlife around the field, with many of our migrant species of birds returning and more butterflies beginning to appear.

Swifts will start arriving, joining the Swallows and House Martins that will already be here. Other migrants making their presence heard include the Whitethroat, Garden warblers and Willow warblers along with the distinctive sound of the Cuckoo, also watch for the Goldfinches singing from the tops of bushes as they're nesting.

Evening visitors to the field will likely see the Tawny Owl on its regular hunts, as well as perhaps two species of bats, the Pipistrelle with its irregular flight above head height, and the less Common Serotine, its broad wings giving it a more leisurely flight at about tree-top height.
