OLD BASING AND LYCHPIT CARNIVAL

This is not my usual update; however things are not as usual as most will fully understand. I do however hope that this message finds you well and taking care of yourselves and your loved ones. With this in mind, I write to advise that we will **not be able to hold** the **Senior Citizens Party** in **February 2021**, due to the current regulations and to ensure our senior citizens are kept safe. We will however review this in the new year and if we can hold it later in 2021 we will.

Regarding the **Carnival Selection Disco**, we had already chosen the Royal Party for the 50th Carnival and therefore was not planning on undertaking a Carnival Disco in 2021.

At the Carnival meeting in September, we discussed at length when to make a decision about the **50th Carnival** scheduled for **19th June 2021**. As you will hopefully appreciate there is a lot of work that goes into preparing for the Carnival in June and this work starts with organising and booking acts, etc from September onwards. Therefore, we have made the decision to **postpone the 50th Carnival** until **18th June 2022**. After the meeting, the Government made a statement indicating that we may have restrictions for the next six months, which we feel validates this decision. We will however seek to undertake a **2021 Scarecrow Festival** and look at other socially distanced events during 2021.

At this meeting, the name of the Carnival was also discussed following feedback from residents that were unaware that Lychpit could participate in our events. The committee highlighted how much positive support and help we get from the Lychpit community and as our Carnival has grown over the years. Therefore, going forwards, we are pleased to announce it will now be known as the **Old Basing and Lychpit Carnival**. We hope this encourages everyone in Lychpit to get involved in the future and you never know it might even generate some new volunteers to join us.

I would also like to announce that **Old Basing and Lychpit Carnival Annual General Meeting (AGM)** will be held virtually for the first time (ever), taking place on **Wednesday**, **18th November**, at **8pm**. All residents of Old Basing and Lychpit are very welcome to attend the AGM, which will be held in public, via Zoom due to current Government restrictions.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PARISH OFFICE

This has been an unusual and difficult year and Kate Hope has been key to helping manage the day-to-day running of the office and other facilities. In recognition of her increased responsibilities and completion of her first year with the Parish Council, Kate has now been promoted to Deputy Clerk.

COVID-19

Few businesses have not been adversely affected by the consequences of lockdown and this also applies to Parish Councils. Income, in particular from the hire of Lychpit Hall and the Pavilion, ceased completely resulting in a loss from Lychpit Hall alone of £9,000 to date. However, running costs still need to be covered and for Lychpit Hall these are in the region of £11,500 per annum. We were pleased to receive a COVID-19 Grant of £2,000 from the Borough Council to compensate for loss of business and contribute towards additional COVID-19 measures; however, when granting this the Borough Council realised they should have been charging Business Rates on the premises thereby resulting in a bill for £1,796! With regular hirers starting to return, income is now trickling in but, with the prospect of party and other bookings unlikely to return until next spring, losses will no doubt continue to rsie.

BOXING DAY WALK

For the first time for many years the Boxing Day Walk will not take place due to the need for social distancing. However, we encourage everyone to take their own Boxing Day walk whilst observing the latest Government Guidelines at the time. Ideas for local walks are on the Parish Council's website – just click on "About our Parish" and scroll down to "Walks around Old Basing" and open the pdf booklet to select your walk.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHP EVENING

We have reluctantly decided to cancel this event this year due to restrictions on social gatherings.

ANNUAL PARISH AWARD

The Parish Council feels that with so many residents having done so much to help those in need during these difficult times, it would not be appropriate to recognise just one person and has therefore decided not to present an award this year.

NEWS FROM BASING HOUSE

The last weekend in October sees our **Halloween events**, all of which require booking and at the time of writing it is not clear whether there are any vacancies; to enquire, full details are at **www.hampshireculture.org.uk/event/halloween-evening-ghost-walks**

The site closes for the winter at 4pm on Sunday, 25th October, except for the pre-booked Halloween events. That leaves us with one more event in 2020 – our Christmas Market in the Great Barn on the weekend of 28th and 29th November, between 10am and 4pm. Pre-booking is essential via our website to ensure we can maintain social distancing, the capacity allowance in the barn, and for COVID-19 track and trace. Arrival booking slots will be every 30 minutes for the market, starting at 10am and ending at 3.30pm. The event is likely to be very popular, so we advise booking in advance to ensure you get tickets. Tickets are £3.50 per adult, £2.50 per child and under 5s free. There will be a strict oneway system in place around the market to ensure social distancing can be maintained and visitors will have to wear face coverings at all times.

This year we will have a **Nativity scene** on **28th November** in the **Cart Shed**, and **Horse Trough Catering** will be offering take-away food and drink from their horse box in the courtyard. The barn and visitor centre will be decorated for Christmas – we are even buying some new decorations for this year!

We do ask visitors to park in our **car park**, by **Bartons Mill**, for the event and not in The Street. Allow five to ten minutes to walk from the car park.

EVENT NEWS



Our work party on Saturday, 21st November, will continue with this winter's plan to tackle the scrub. We aim to clear areas of ash, oak and thorn to allow smaller plants to flourish and renew the views for walkers across the site and keep the paths clear. No special skills are required but volunteers are asked to bring their own gardening-type

gloves, a pen for signing in and your own refreshments. Tools, which will be disinfected before and after use, will be provided. We meet and will be working on the lower path (next to the woods) from **10am** and work for about **two hours**. Any last-minute changes due to COVID-19 will be posted on Facebook and the field notice board, or if you can email that you are coming then I can provide updates.

WHAT TO LOOK OUT FOR THIS MONTH

As temperatures drop Roe deer will become more evident, and you may see some early winter visitors like the Siskin, Brambling and Lesser Redpoll, as well as increased numbers of Starling, Song Thrush and Redwing. Browsing the various sources of food there will be groups of Long Tailed Tits around with large mixed groups of other species.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR


In September's Basinga you used the unfortunate heading "Have your say on plans to stamp out dog fouling". Picture that for a moment because those plans (proposed by Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council) will indeed likely 'spread' the problem and cause it to be more resilient.

There is little evidence in the public domain to support such a proposal having any positive impact on its own. It also ignores the serious issue of discarded poo bags left hanging on fences, in hedges and so 'thoughtfully' left on the edges of paths for somebody else to deal with. There doesn't appear to be any visibility of a wider and more appropriate plan. The proposal does make me think that the whole purpose of it is simply for councillors to appear to be taking a 'tough line'. They certainly appear a bit confused and muddled in their approach by proposing controversial action first without properly completing the public engagement and consultation. Over the last eight years or so, during which I estimate I've personally removed over one tonne of litter (including hundreds of used poo bags) from our footpaths and the Loddon, the casual indifference shown by councillors (with one notable exception) is lamentable. Thankfully there are many other local people who are having a positive impact on littering generally.

Whilst it is only the minority who are irresponsible 'dog poo offenders', it is most likely that they will be the ones who respond most destructively to the application of such a poorly thought out proposal. We can certainly expect more discarded poo bags and quite possibly an 'adverse' reaction from the 'mindless' within that minority if challenged. They can be aggressive when challenged and so should only be approached by those prepared for abuse and trained to deal with aggressive behaviour. Have councillors really given any thought to that and the practical application of enforcement? I doubt it very much.

This is a complex problem to solve and is not one that can be dealt with by simple solutions for the sake of political expediency. The public engagement is commendable but has been back to front. The Council needs to stop, start again in a structured way, build on the public engagement so far and produce a considered, appropriate and co-ordinated plan. That plan must deal with the different aspects of the whole issue and then be properly implemented. The approach so far is inadequate and sadly is doomed to fail at dealing with the problem it's intended to fix.

INNER RESOURCES

Dear Friends,

At the time of writing the winter, Christmas and what follows all look pretty dreary. The pandemic is spreading; further lockdown looks likely. How do you cope? Especially if you're living on your own and are cut off from other people.

Drawing on deep inner resources seems to be part of the challenge of our times. I've thought of some important areas that you might find helpful, a kind of "10 Commandments". You might want to adapt them into your own "Rules for Living".

- 1) Keep in contact. Finding ways of connecting with people-via the phone or other means can be vitally important-for other people and for you.
- 2) Look outwards. Taking an interest in what is happening and responding to the need of others helps to free us from the burden of being too self-preoccupied.
- 3) Seek stimulation. Whether it's television, music, books or whatever it may be, make time for the areas of life you find interesting.
- 4) Welcome laughter. Humour rapidly restores perspective and is a basic human quality for enjoying the gift of life.
- 5) Take time to reflect. If there is one activity, above all, that I find deeply life-giving it is making room for prayer. Simply being quiet in mindfulness or meditation can be a great source of strength.
- 6) Keep physically active. As well as exercise of various kinds, just keeping on the move can be important.
- 7) Be creative. Finding ways of retaining and developing skills has great value.
- 8) Keep alert. Keeping informed and being mentally active helps us in meeting life's challenges
- 9) Rest adequately. If we can avoid depriving ourselves of sleep and can comfortably relax, this gives us far more than we might have expected.
- 10) Try new things. Maybe just changing the way we usually react to situations, changing our attitudes as well as experimenting with different activities may be helpful.

Whether these will be gloomy months, or whether we'll be pleasantly surprised, however we formulate our own "Rule of life" or "10 Commandments", we are likely to need to draw more deeply on the inner resources essential to our humanity.

OLD BASING ALLOTMENT AND GARDEN SOCIETY (OBAGS)

Unfortunately due to the ongoing COVID situtation, the OBAGS committee have decided to keep the **shop closed** until at least the **end of March next year**. The complexities of making the shop COVID-compliant and therefore minimising the risk to the volunteers were just too difficult to implement for our small shop. To ensure that no-one is unfairly disadvantaged by this decision, the committee has also agreed that **2020 membership cards will remain valid throughout 2021**. The last inspections of the year have now been completed but there is still plenty of work to be done.

All types of currant bushes can be pruned anytime between now and March, and autumn-fruiting raspberry canes should be cut to the ground. You can begin planting onion, garlic and shallots now, ensuring you cover them with fleece to protect them from bad weather. Brassicas should be netted to protect them from pigeons and Brussels sprouts should be staked to prevent damage from high winds.





NOVEMBER IN YOUR GARDEN

We are now in the time of year where we can be experiencing a mix of frost, gales and hailstones (hopefully not all at the same time)! It is imperative that tender plants are protected from these weather conditions. Move them into the greenhouse, a sheltered spot near the house or, if all else fails, wrap the pots in fleece or bubble wrap to keep out the worst of the weather.

Continue to rake fallen leaves from lawns to ensure that the grass gets a good amount of light and moisture. If the temperature remains mild, then it may be necessary to continue to trim back grass, be sure to keep the blades high to reduce stress. You can also do some autumn lawn care: scarifying, aerating and top dressing in mild weather but be sure not to do this if the ground is frosty, waterlogged or snow covered. Also, it is worth avoiding walking on frosty grass as it will damage the grass.

In the flowerbeds you can continue to cut back faded perennials but if you can, try to leave some stems uncut to provide over-wintering spots for friendly insects such as ladybirds and lacewings that will help with controlling greenfly next year. Tulip bulbs should be planted this month and it is not too late to try plant some winter bedding such as violas or bellis. Ornamental grasses can be cut back and tidied, as can bamboo and you can still lift and divide overgrown perennials if you haven't already done so. The very best thing you can do for your flowerbeds now is to apply an autumn mulch, especially around the base of plants that are borderline hardy, such as kniphofia.

If you are in need of new flowerbeds then this is a good time to make a start, providing the ground isn't too waterlogged as walking on very wet soil will cause it to become compacted. Digging and turning over the soil will expose hidden pests and eggs, and allow the birds to get a free feast. Be sure not to leave the newly dug soil exposed too long though as excessive rain will wash away valuable nutrients. If you aren't planning on mulching, then cover the ground with black polythene to help keep the goodness in.

Lots of bare-root plants will be available to buy this month. This includes hedging plants as well as roses, which are usually considerably cheaper than buying them as potted specimens. Bare-root plants need to be got in the soil as soon as possible lest their roots dry out. Try and plan ahead with your purchase so that you can be on hand when they are delivered to get them straight into their final positions. If you can do this, then heel them in and keep them well watered until you have more time. Newly planted trees and shrubs are best protected from gales with temporary net windbreaks until their roots have become established and they are strong enough to hold themselves firm. If you have plants growing in the wrong position, this is the perfect time to relocate them to somewhere more suitable. This works best with plants younger than a couple of years old. If they are more mature than this then the root ball may be too large to ensure the move is successful. In this case, it might be best leaving well alone!

Keep an eye on any bulbs that you are forcing indoors for a festive display. Amaryllis bulbs can be brought into active growth with regular watering and feeding, whilst hyacinths and paper white daffodils should be brought into a cool, light room once they have about an inch of growth and then into warmer rooms once flower buds begin to appear. Succulents and cacti very much need a period of rest over winter. Keep them barely moist and don't be tempted to feed them until the spring when active growth starts and your normal care routine can be resumed. Happy gardening.

NATURE NOTES FOR NOVEMBER

I've frequently mentioned that part of the joy of angling is that one sees so much nature



when you're sat quietly by a lake or river. That includes the shy, the pretty and the scary, depending on your point of view, so having half a dozen grass snakes swimming your way in quick succession might not be everyone's idea of a relaxing days fishing! I was at Billhook lake near Roke yesterday (15th September) when the slippery chaps came off a little island situated on the

lake and headed towards the margins. The bailiff had previously told me that there were always a few in the vicinity and that the mass showing yesterday was that he believed there was something attractive to them food wise in the lily-pad patches. It was a novelty for sure and more than I've ever seen in one place before, so I made sure I took a bit of video and some pictures (see photo above).

From drought-like conditions in August and September with the usual threats of water shortages abounding, we hit the autumn equinox and suddenly began a subaqueous existence! Over four inches of rain must have fallen last weekend (3rd/4th October) as a garden vessel which I know had been empty, was now full to the brim. I had to take a couple of bucketsful of water from my small pond to prevent the fish invading my decking and the large pots containing hostas weighed a ton so in the greenhouse they went. However, this regular autumn deluge results in perfect conditions for flushing out leaves and dead matter from the rivers and will help deoxygenated ponds and lakes to recover, as well as filling the aquafers on which we depend.

Many people see frogs in their gardens, so this weather suits them brilliantly. Michael Haynes saw my article two issues ago about the demise of the frog population due to the harsh winter two years ago. His pond has fish, and they eat the spawn that appears each year, so he moved several clumps to a neighbours 'fishless' pond back in the lockdown. Most hatched with the result there are now hundreds of one-inch long frogs all over Cavalier



Road gardens. It's especially good news if you're a heron or a grass snake but frogs will eat slugs so they're useful to have around for gardeners too.

We usually refer to heavy rain as 'nice weather for ducks' and there are always **Mallards** whizzing around the Belle Vue area, presumably birds from the village end of the canal which usually has water in it. However graceful and fluid they look in flight is all undone with their movement on the ground, or

should I say their demeanour. Terry McAnish took a picture (see photo, left) of this one sat on his roof and it just doesn't look right.

Now is the right time to put up or take down nest boxes. Siting a box correctly is all important and if the one you've removed to clean has no material in it, perhaps not for the first year, then consider a new site if at all possible. If it was already north or east facing, then it could be a matter of its height (too high or low) or that the birds are not using it because of its exposure to potential predators or human interaction. Tit boxes need to be between six and eight feet off the ground ideally but as you've probably seen in media coverage, they'll nest in the weirdest of places if it takes their fancy. Apertures in traffic lights, external wall-mounted ash trays, drainpipes and vehicles have all been rendered temporarily out of order whilst eggs hatch and young fledge.

HAMPSHIRE AND ISLE OF WIGHT WILDLIFE TRUST

In the world of wildlife, the word 'camouflage' can mean a lot of things. It sometimes refers to mimicry, which means being seen but incorrectly identified - think grasshoppers pretending to be dead leaves. The attributes we associate most with camouflage, however, are things which make animals hard to see at all; this is known as crypsis.

A CLEAR ADVANTAGE: Invisibility may sound like the stuff of fantasy, but it's surprisingly common in our seas. True transparency is tricky to achieve – any food eaten will be visible, and eyes must be opaque in order to function. But partial transparency can still be useful, especially in shallower waters where light is plentiful. Even the stealthiest animals are visible from above by the shadow they cast on the seabed, and from below by their silhouette. Since more light can pass through their bodies, transparent species have a diffuse outline from both angles, which makes it harder for predators and prey to identify them. Local examples of this superpower include the common shrimp, the moon jellyfish, and the aptly named transparent goby.

COLOURFUL CHARACTERS: If transparency isn't an option then clever use of colour could be the answer. Sardines, herrings, and sea bass are all darker along their spines, which is called countershading. In natural lighting the tops of objects are illuminated while their undersides fall into shadow. These fish are darker on top and lighter underneath, creating an optical illusion that helps them blend into their environment. Seahorses, and flatfish like plaice, go one step further: they use pigment-filled skin cells called chromatophores to match the colour and pattern of their surroundings.

DRESS TO IMPRESS: Some of our marine species get crafty and enhance their natural camouflage with items from their environment. Dahlia anemones have sticky warts on their bodies which pick up pieces of shell, sand, and gravel. When their tentacles are retracted the anemones can be almost entirely obscured by these pieces of debris. Several species of spider crab are called 'decorators' due to their love of accessorising. The great spider crab, for instance, has a shell with a rough and knobbly surface; this acts like velcro, allowing the crab to disguise itself with pieces of seaweed and sponge. Over time, these decorations can become a home for tiny animals like hydroids, making each crab a walking habitat!


