BASING SINGERS AND BASINGSTOKE MALE VOICE CHOIR

No matter which day or time I enter St Mary's Church I find visitors there looking around the building where people have gathered and worshipped for centuries.

The Visitors Book has been signed by travellers from abroad, by people coming back to their roots and by people who live locally who come to recall their family baptisms, weddings and funerals giving sense of belonging.

A television programme once showed a presenter holding a microphone to an old stone wall trying to hear the echoes of the past. At St Mary's I can imagine the stonemason builders' clunk of stone upon stone. Later came the clatter of horses and soldiers during the English Civil War. I wonder at the seventeenth-century discussions that followed on how best to restore the building as a result of a national appeal.

I magine the giggles of the choir boys in services and their excitement climbing the tower for judo lessons between the wars. Do the walls echo with the many lives celebrated on the kneelers?

Unsurprisingly St Mary's Church is a Grade 1 listed building. The worn steps show many people's care through the centuries. It is our turn now. Today the Friends of St Mary's are amongst those who maintain the fabric of the Church through social fundraising. This has seen many a happy event and continues on Saturday, 26th November, at 7.30 pm (doors open at 7 pm). We have arranged a concert featuring the Basing Singers and the Basingstoke Male Voice Choir in Old Basing Village Hall. "Museums are not static but dynamic": thus wrote George Willis (1877–1970), Basingstoke shopkeeper, antiquarian and local historian, one-time mayor, first Freeman of the Borough, and, in 1931, the founder of the Borough Museum that evolved into the justly named Willis Museum, now run by Hampshire Cultural Trust (HCT) and called the Willis Museum and Sainsbury Gallery. Visit the Museum's website www.hampshireculture.org.uk/willis-museum-and-sainsbury-gallery and you will clearly see that it lives up to Mr Willis's wise dictum in no uncertain fashion.

With high-profile touring exhibitions in the Sainsbury Gallery, frequently changing exhibitions by local people and groups in the Basingstoke Community Gallery – this could be you or your group – and its programmes of talks, workshops, and family activities, you can go there many times a year for a new experience every time. Oh, and enjoy a great morning coffee, or afternoon cup of tea and slice of cake.

No surprise, then, that the Willis has a dynamic **Friends' Association**, founded in 1978 to 'promote, support and improve the Willis Museum.' Members enjoy ten free evening lectures a year, mostly about local history, a guided summer visit, newsletters, discounts in the museum café and shop, and, importantly, an opportunity to volunteer their services in interesting ways – all of this for £12 per year. It shows how important the correct management of the site is to provide the best possible habitat for these furry species.

Browsing the various sources of food there will be groups of Long Tailed Tits around with large mixed groups of other species.

November, a rather bleak and occasionally inaccurate picture of this month by British poet **Thomas Hood** (1799–1855). November can be an attractive month between a colourful autumn and winter frosts.

For most of us in the Church, November is a time of Remembrance. It starts with the great festival of **All Saints Day** when we celebrate the grace of God in the life of great servants of his people through the ages. They kept the flame of faith, the Light of Christ, shining in their generation. They were mostly ordinary men and women who did extraordinary things.

On 2nd November, All Souls Day, we remember with gratitude and affection those we have loved but see no longer except through faith in the kingdom of God (the All Souls Service in church will be on Saturday 5th, November, see opposite page).

But chiefly, we come together on Armistice Day 11.11.11 and on Remembrance Sunday to commemorate those who in two global 20th-century wars and other conflicts since have laid down their lives to protect and preserve our basic human right to live freely and in peace. One tradition was to bake "Cattern cakes" (the main ingredients of which are bread dough, egg, sugar, lard, cinnamon and caraway seeds). And you know the firework, the Catherine wheel? Apparently this firework is so-called because it represents the back-breaking spiked wheel by which Saint Catherine was sentenced to death for defending the Christian faith. The story goes that when she touched it, this apparatus of torture miraculously fell to pieces.

In France, Saint Catherine is patron of unmarried women and those unmarried women over the age of 25 were known as Catherinettes. Single women would make a decorative hat with green and yellow ribbons and flowers to signal their "availability" and attend special balls. Although these traditions have died out in most parts of France, some parties are still held in the north and east of France. While some 'Catherinettes' celebrate the day in hope of soon being married, others proudly embrace their single life.

In Estonia, Saint Catherine (or Kadripäev as it is known there) is still widely celebrated. It marks the arrival of winter and is a day dedicated to women. People dress in costumes and masks, and go door-to-door performing and singing and collecting gifts or sweets. In Estonia, Catherine, or Kadri (a popular name in Estonia), is also the protector of livestock and the holiday is meant to bring luck and safety to cattle and sheep during the winter.

On 25th November, we at Linguatastic won't necessarily be celebrating Saint Catherine, but as it is a Friday, we will be running two after-school French clubs in the village. We offer an array of language-learning classes, incorporating various levels, languages, days/times of the week. POEM TO MARK THE DEATH OF QUEEN ELIZABETH II

The **British Poet Laureate, Simon Armitage**, has penned a poem to mark the death of Queen Elizabeth II.

Floral Tribute, which has been distributed by Armitage's publisher, Faber, describes the coming of a September evening and the appearance of a Lily-of-the-valley as a 'token of thanks' – one of the Queen's favourite flowers.

The beautiful white bloom, which featured in Her Majesty's coronation bouquet in 1953, is a permanent feature of the floral displays at Buckingham Palace. Elegant and hardy, it has dark green leaves, bell-shaped, fragrant flowers, and is famed for being relatively easy to grow (see 'October In Your Garden' in the October edition of the Basinga).

In the poem, Simon employs the form of a double acrostic, using the first letter of each line to spell out Elizabeth. He uses the metaphor of a lily to represent both the poem and the Queen, writing: "This lily that thrives between spire and tree, whose brightness/Holds and glows beyond the life and border of its bloom."

Later he adds: "The country loaded its whole self into your slender hands, Hands that can rest, now, relieved of a century's weight" and pays homage to "a promise made and kept for life".

Evening will come, however determined the late afternoon,
Limes and oaks in their last green flush, pearled in September mist.

I have conjured a lily to light these hours, a token of thanks,
Zones and auras of soft glare framing the brilliant globes.

A promise made and kept for life - that was your gift -Because of which, here is a gift in return, glovewort to some,

Each shining bonnet guarded by stern lance-like leaves.

The country loaded its whole self into your slender hands, Hands that can rest, now, relieved of a century's weight.

Evening has come. Rain on the black lochs and dark Munros.

Lily of the Valley, a namesake almost, a favourite flower

Interlaced with your famous bouquets, the restrained

Zeal and forceful grace of its lanterns, each inflorescence

A silent bell disguising a singular voice. A blurred new day

Breaks uncrowned on remote peaks and public parks, and

Everything turns on these luminous petals and deep roots,

This lily that thrives between spire and tree, whose brightness

Holds and glows beyond the life and border of its bloom.

NOVEMBER IN YOUR GARDEN

Winter may be on the doorstep but there is still delight to be taken from the colours and depth in your garden and outdoor spaces. Trees are amazing things and as they sense a shift in daylight levels, they begin making changes to become more tolerant of cold temperatures. After the ravishes of the summer drought, what leaves are left, should be falling rapidly as the wind and rain increase but relish in the colours that they have and the thought of bursting back to life in spring. It may be a nuisance that you have to rake your lawns but leaf fall not only protects the trees from the effects of wind but also provides an excellent leaf mould, it's formed from decaying leaves and produces an invaluable soil conditioner.

As the weather gets colder, pots need feet to keep them out of standing water and to stop the compost freezing in the bottom of the pot. Fleece (or bubble wrap if they are in a less windy area) your tender plants or move them under cover to avoid them becoming sodden but please do look after them with a bit of water when needed. Overwatering is the most common cause of loss of container plants; watering should aim to keep the compost moist, never soggy and avoid alternating dryness and saturation.

Roses in November are usually dormant. There is nothing to do now but reduce the size to help them survive root rock. Winter is regarded as the best season to prune most types of roses but rambling roses should already have been pruned after last flowering. Do not worry about them being exposed to extreme frosty conditions or snow as they are in hibernation and will be unaffected by the weather. If you have outdoor planters standing empty during the winter months, try some evergreen shrubs such as potted topiary using box, or fill them with winter bedding plants such as ornamental cabbages and winter flowering pansies. Lawns will still need care and attention. Rake when necessary, avoid scarifying and foot traffic but don't be afraid to use the lawn mower on milder days.

Berries on bushes and trees will be a feast for birds; blackbirds and thrushes will become more noticeable searching your lawn for worms. Food and water may start to become in short supply for birds but they will repay you with keeping pests down. Leave food out for birds every day, including supplementary food such as suet and sunflower hearts and fallen fruit. It's also a good idea to leave seeds on herbaceous plants and shrubs, and don't forget to keep your bird bath topped up and fight off the squirrels!

November can be thought of as the start of the gardening year where traditionally trees and shrubs are planted ready for next year's growth. Treat yourself to something new for your garden.

NATURE NOTES FOR NOVEMBER

I've been amazed at how things have recovered from the heatwave. Trees, plants and lawns all looked stressed beyond a point of return, yet four to five weeks on, everything looks like spring growth. The mower has been out more times in September than in the whole of the summer and at long last, I've been able to cut some dahlias and roses for the house.

Some local Cavalier Road residents have helped me put to good use the glut of eating and cooking apples that have overloaded my two trees, and my good lady has been cooking crumbles, cakes and all things including apple. Mind you, many pounds of windfalls were processed in late August to produce four gallons of cider which has just been bottled here too and hopefully around Christmas, I can still be enjoying a blend of Worcester eater and Brambly cooker fermented apple juice!

Sadly, the virus that certain finches have suffered from over the past decade is still around with two residents reporting dead Greenfinches and one Chaffinch. Truth to tell the latter bird looked to be a juvenile but the lady that let me know about its demise said it looked lethargic beforehand which is a tell-tale sign of Trichomonosis. So, if you are a regular bird feeder do please ensure your vessels are kept as clean as possible and that water dishes are changed regularly.
